Javits Proposes Strike Legislation

Washington - (UPI) - Sen Jacob K. Javits (R-N. Y.) believes Congress should consider legislation to deal more strongly with strikes, including possible government seizure of struck industries.

Javits, whose state is being affected by a New York newspaper strike and a longshoremen's strike, said Sunday night that the government had "no effective national policy to deal with major strikes, or even national emergency strikes."

"The Taft-Hartley injunction just doesn't work," he declared.

Javits said that "the fact-finding technique, plus recommendations for settlement" were other weapons which should be given to the President to help settle strikes.

Fisherman Feared Drowned in Sandy

Portland - (UPI) - A sports fisherman was missing and presumed drowned in the Sandy river near here today.

Vernon Rutherford, 42, Gresham, disappeared Sunday while fishing from a bank about five miles southeast of Springfield.

A Multnomah county sheriff's deputy said he apparently drowned when he went into the river to straighten out a snagged line. His fishing rod was found in the river.

Ontario Man Dies Of Injuries in Fire

Ontario, Ore. - (UPI) - John Dillard, 78, Ontario, died at a hospital here Saturday from burns suffered in a fire at his home on New Year's day. Dillard was burned when he got up to stoke a stove and his bedding caught fire Tuesday morning. His house was not damaged by the blaze.

Savannah Attracts 16,670 at Portland

Portland - (UPI) - Some 16,670 persons toured the nuclear-powered ship Savannah during the week end.

The \$53 million vessel was scheduled to be visited by special technical maritime groups from 9 p.m. to noon and was to be open to the public from noon to 4 p.m.

A total of 9,592 persons streamed onto the ship Sunday and 7,078 visitors were recorded Saturday. The vessel arrived in Portland late Friday.

The Savannah, which is operated by States Marine Lines for the federal government, will remain open through Wednesday. It is scheduled to leave for San Diego Thursday morning.

Sunday's crowd was the second biggest to tour the ship on the Pacific Coast. At Long Beach, Calif., 10,306 visited the vessel in one day.

Anderson Hearing Will Be Reopened

Mountain Home, Idaho, - (UPI) - A military hearing into the murder case against Al-c Gerald M. Anderson will be reopened again Wednesday morning, the Air Force disclosed today.

Purpose of the reopening will be for the introduction of new statements in Anderson's behalf, including results of an Office of Special Investigations inquiry in the case.

Since conclusion of the eight-day hearing at Mountain Home AFB last month, OSI agents have been working around the clock on the case and have administered a lie

detector test to a civilian who has admitted the murders for which Anderson is charged.

Anderson, 25, of San Diego, is accused by the Air Force of premeditated murder in the knife slayings here last April 9 of Mrs. Nancy Joy Johnson, 22, and her son, Daniel, 2 1/2. He was freed of a murder charge in Mrs. Johnson's death last November by a civilian court but was re-arrested by the Air Force and charged with both crimes.

Since then, a 22-year-old Boise laborer, Theodore Thomas Dickie, has confessed that he and not Anderson committed the murders.

Another Penguin Dies at Portland

Portland - (UPI) - Another of the Portland Zoo's new Emperor penguins died during the week end.

Seven Emperors and 15 Adelle penguins have died since a new group arrived last month. Dr. Matthew Maberry, zoon veterinarian, said he believed the illness which has killed the penguins is under control and that the latest victim apparently died from lingering effects of the ailment.
