Edward Kennedy
Wants To Stay
Out of Limelight

Washington—UPI—Sen. Edward M. Kennedy (D-Mass.) says he'll "stay out of the swimming pool" to make his congressional record "as good as Vaughn Meader's."

The President's youngest brother and fellow freshmen members of Congress were entertained Wednesday night at a Women's National Press Club annual fête for newly elected representatives.

Kenney, 30, was one of 13 freshmen senators and congressmen who were questioned at the dinner about their relations with the President, their legislative goals and ambitions.

Out of Limelight
In the future, Kennedy said he wanted to "stay out of the limelight, out of the headlines, and out of the swimming pool." Last summer, at a party given by Atty. Gen. and Mrs. Robert F. Kennedy, some guests, including White House aide Arthur Schlesinger Jr., fell into the Kennedy swimming pool.

As for his brother, the Massachusetts Democrat said that after a White House visit with the President to discuss ideas for the State of the Union message, "The only thing I got out of him was, 'Are you still using that greasy kid stuff?'"

He quipped that "I've been helping him for a number of years, and now I think it's time he stood on his own feet."

Record Dropping Urged
Vice president Lyndon B. Johnson, the guest speaker, said that the way for a new congressman to get a reputation of being in the inner circle was not through the old method of name dropping. Record dropping has replaced this, he said.

As an example of a good publicity technique, the vice president pointed to the "Mona Lisa" approach used by Sen. Carl Hayden (D-Ariz.).

"He doesn't admit anything, he doesn't deny anything, he doesn't say anything," Johnson said. "He just smiles, and has smiled for years," and that has led to Hayden getting some of the kindest stories written about a representative on Capitol Hill, Johnson declared.

Seat Belt Measure
Receives Approval

Salem—UPI—A proposal to ask the legislature to require seat belts in cars sold in Oregon starting in 1964 was approved Wednesday by the Oregon Traffic Safety Commission.

The bill also would require seat belt attachments for rear seats in cars. It will be cosponsored by the Board of Health.

The commission also approved a motion by director Vern L. Hill of the Motor Vehicles Department to seek periodic motor vehicle inspection.

The commission voted in favor of an increase in funds for schools offering driver education. The increase would bring the state's contribution to 90 per cent of the cost of the course, up to \$50 per pupil, instead of the present 75 per cent.

The commission voted to support the present minimum driver age of 16, reversing an earlier position that would have raised the age to 18.

Students Protest
Chapel Attendance

Brunswick, Maine—UPI—Five-hundred students crowded into the Bowdoin College chapel Wednesday in protest of compulsory chapel attendance.

The chapel seats only 200 and the other 300 sat on the floor or stood in aisles.

The demonstration, termed "dignified and good natured," apparently stemmed from a notice given to the 800-member student body by Prof. A. Leroy Greason Jr., dean of students.

He said many students would fall short of minimum chapel attendance requirements at the end of the first semester and it would be "adequate basis for any later action."

Seniors are required to attend 15 daily and five Sunday services each semester; juniors and sophomores 20 and five and freshmen 25 and six.

Atlanta—UPI—The Atlanta post office ruled Wednesday that letter writers lacking new 5-cent stamps cannot post their mail with a 4-cent stamp and one-quarter of a 4-cent stamp. It was replying to a writer who said in a note on an envelope that he had a 4-cent stamp but no 1-cent stamp "so I cut a 4-cent stamp into four pieces."
