Pear Blossom Parade Scheduled April 20

The first official meeting of the year for the planning committee of the annual Pear Blossom Festival was held Thursday at the Medford hotel.

Bill Dugan, president, announced that Saturday, April 20, had been selected for the pear blossom parade.

The date selected falls on the Saturday following Easter Sunday, Dugan noted, and follows the pattern established in the past of selecting the date far enough in advance to allow adequate planning.

Experience has shown that it is impossible to predict the height of the blossom time of the valley pear orchards, but the Saturday following Easter has been satisfactory from the standpoint of catering to the youngsters who participated and valley schools who send their marching bands, he noted.

Since actual pear blossoms are not used by the children in float decorations the proximity to "blossom time" is not the most important consideration, it was pointed out.

Also in the planning stages for the same week end are several other events which will enhance the festivities. These include an art exhibit, a Crater Lions special event

and a promotion by the Medford merchants, who sponsor the pear blossom parade.

The next meeting of the Pear Blossom Festival association, comprised of representatives of various service and fraternal organizations, will be held at 7 a.m. Tuesday, Jan. 22, at the Medford hotel. Dugan reminded all organizations to have their representatives at the meeting to aid in planning this annual event.
