

OSU Moves Up To Tenth In Ratings; Cincinnati First

New York — (UPI) — Unbeaten Loyola of Chicago ran its season record to 15-0 but lost ground today in its battle to overtake Cincinnati as the nation's No. 1 major college basketball team in the United Press International ratings.

For the seventh straight week the Bearcats from Cincinnati headed the UPI ratings and for the top spot in the balloting by the 35-man UPI board of coaches.

Loyola, which trailed Cincinnati by 60 points a week ago, slipped to a 69-point deficit this week despite adding two more victories for the nation's best record of the 1962-63 season. Cincinnati also added two more victories last week, beating North Texas State and Tulsa for a 13-0 record. Each team has 11 games left to play.

Illinois (11-1) and Arizona State (14-1) held onto the third and fourth spots, respectively, while Ohio State, beaten by Illinois last Monday, slipped from fifth to eighth and Oregon State (9-4) rejoined the top 10 in the only significant changes.

Duke defeated Navy and Clemson to boost its record to 12-2 and take over fifth while Georgia Tech (11-0) moved into sixth place and Wichita (11-3) advanced from ninth to seventh. Mississippi State (10-3), eighth a week ago, slipped one notch to ninth and Oregon State replaced UCLA in 10th.

Colorado State U., Colorado, UCLA, Notre Dame, West Virginia, Stanford, Kentucky, Niagara, Texas and Utah State made up the second 10.

The coaches based their ratings on games played through Saturday, Jan. 12, prior to Monday night's Illinois-Northwestern game.

Termed Illegal Detroit Choice

Detroit — (UPI) — Two Los Angeles Representatives charged Sunday that Detroit's selection to make the official United States' bid for the 1968 Olympic Games was "illegal."

John Quinn, special assistant to Los Angeles Mayor Sam Yorty, and Mel Pierson, chairman of Los Angeles' Special Commission for the Olympic Games, made the charge at a meeting with six Detroit Olympic officials at the Detroit Athletic Club.

Detroit has been selected by the United States Olympic Committee to make the official U.S. bid for the 1968 Olympic Games but Los Angeles is fighting that decision.

The International Olympic Committee will pick the 1968 site next fall in a meeting at Nairobi, Africa.

Quinn said the site committee vote was illegal because there were only four members present along with two alternates.

"Three of the four members were for us. The two alternates were against us and were illegal," Quinn claimed. "One of the regulars finally switched to Detroit to break

Harvey Kuenn Comes to Terms With SF Giants

San Francisco — (UPI) — Harvey Kuenn, the San Francisco Giants veteran outfielder — third baseman, phoned from his home near Milwaukee and accepted terms for the 1963 season, the club announced today.

The tobacco-chewing "take charge guy" was believed to be in line for approximately \$35,000 — the same salary which he received during the 1962 campaign when he batted .304 in 130 games.

Kuenn, the second Giant to come to terms, is entering his 11th major league season.

He came to the Giants from Cleveland in 1961 and batted .265 while getting adjusted to National league pitching. It marked only the second time that he had dropped below .300.

Kuenn won the American league batting title with a .353 at Detroit in 1959.

He told the Giants that he was in "very good shape" and close to his playing weight of 190 pounds.
