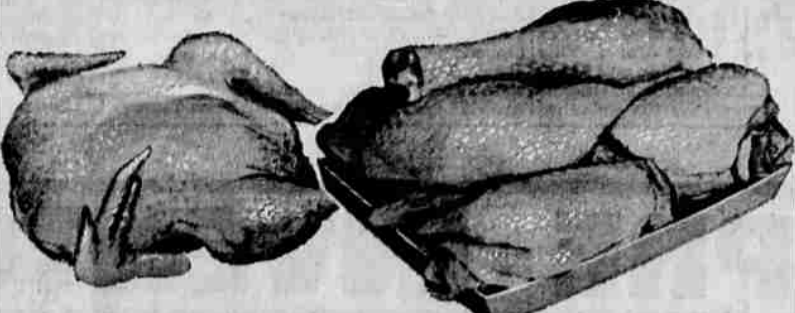

Captive Quail Together in an Unlocked, Open-Door Prison
The wide open door of the long, shed-like building must have offered a challenge of sorts to a lone, female quail that entered the opening. The owner of the barn was nearby and watched the bird stop into the open door; she stood for a minute, then flew into the interior.
The man forgot the incident until the next day when he noticed the quail was evidently trying to get out, but insisted on flying back and forth in the upper part of the structure. In spite of the wide open door the bird steadfastly refused to descend down to the level of the opening.
The next day, and the day after that, the man again noticed the quail still moving about in the upper rafters and boards; she was a prisoner in an unlocked prison. Tired out and unsuccessful in eliciting the quail, the man descended to the shed-floor and, leaving the door open as usual, went into his house, for his belated evening meal.
Heard a Quail
Several days passed, during which time the family heard a quail calling from the meadow back of the house, and later the calls seemed to come from the back yard. The call seemed rather sad and lonely, as if the caller was very discouraged by receiving no answer, and without seeing the absent one come sneaking through the grass and weeds to his persistent invitation.
On two evenings the family watched a lone quail walking in the farmyard, stopping frequently to call. The other quail, the man found, was still living in the shed and apparently finding enough food to live on while there, but never once did he find her on the shed floor.

VA Hospital Expansion Planned
Portland - (UP) - Plans for a \$15.8 million expansion of the Veterans Administration hospital here are being made, the office of Rep. Edith Green (D-Ore.), said today.
The addition would include 505 beds including 240 for psychiatric purposes. Mrs. Green reported the work also calls for consolidation of the outpatient clinic with the hospital and an increase in research space. The outpatient clinic is now in the Lincoln building.

Three More Escape From East Germany
Berlin - (UP) - Three East Germans evaded Communist border guards and escaped safely through barbed wire to West Berlin before dawn today, West Berlin police reported.
The refugees were not identified.
Another unidentified young man, believed to be a West Berliner, was arrested for undetermined reasons Wednesday night by Red guards at a border-crossing point in the U.S. sector and led off into Communist East Berlin.

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
