Taffy-Pull as Social Event Thing of Past
 New York-UPI—There must be millions of kids in the United States today who never have experienced the gummy joys of a taffy-pull. The taffy-pull was a winter indoor sport. It made a sort of kitchen social event out of the production of candy at home. A certain amount of friendly cooperation was required to convert molasses and other ingredients from a stiff and balky mass into a spiraled coil of sweetness which was then set outside to cool and harden, while everyone inside the house washed up. Once solidified, the coil could be crashed into pieces and presto, candy. **Pushed Into Discard** Mass production methods, the availability of confections in vending machines everywhere, the bargain buys on candy at the supermarkets, have pushed the taffy-pull mostly into the discard, except as a stunt or a novelty, as a source for candy. But the desire of sweet stuff, the nation's candy manufacturers report, has been rolling along unabated. Sales for 1961, the latest year for which the U.S. department of commerce had figures, were \$1.23 billion, a record high. With more than 2,000 varieties of candy to choose from, consumers were averaging 17.2 pounds of candy products a year, and the consumption graph line had been rising slightly each year for seven years. As in every mass consumer industry, competition among makers is high. New packaging, new products flow constantly through the markets, usually the results of careful research and preparation.
