

# Oregon State Moves Back Up To 9th Place in UPI Ratings

New York—UPI—Cincinnati, which overcame its toughest non-conference hurdle in Illinois last Saturday, today was the unanimous choice for the sixth straight week of the United Press International board of major college basketball coaches.

The Bearcats, who beat Illinois, 62-53, for their 53rd consecutive victory and 15th remained the No. 1 choice of the 35-man UPI board for the ninth week in a row.

Loyola of Chicago, unbeaten in 18 games, held a tight rein on second place for the sixth straight week.

Duke, which handed West Virginia a 111-71 beating to score its 13th victory in 15 games, moved ahead of Illinois into the No. 3 spot. Illinois lost to Cincinnati moved the Big Ten leaders to fourth place.

Arizona State U. remained No. 5 and Georgia Tech held onto the sixth position while Stanford jumped two notches to seventh place; Colorado was eighth, Oregon State ninth and Wichita 10th.

Mississippi State, seventh

a week ago, dropped to 11th place after being upset by Memphis State, last Saturday. West Virginia, rated No. 10 last week, plummeted to 17th place by losing to Duke.

Colorado, the Big Eight leader, and Oregon State, an independent team, are the newcomers in this week's top 10. Wichita, beaten by North Texas State last Friday, slipped two notches to 10th place.

# Fame Hall Adds Four

New York—UPI—Sam Rice and Eppa Rixey displayed happiness mixed with bitterness and 87-year-old Elmer Flick said, "I figured I was too old for anybody to remember me."

That was the reaction of three old baseballers' old-timers who were elected Sunday to the Hall of Fame along with John Clarkson, a National League pitcher before the turn of the century who died 53 years ago.

Rice, repeatedly passed over in past balloting by the main body of the Baseball Writers' association of America, finally won the nod from the Hall of Fame's 12-man veteran committee. He and Rixey were elected from a category of players who retired between 1931 and 1943.

Clarkson and Flick were chosen from another category of old-timers who retired before 1931.

Rice and Rixey both admitted they were "very happy" over their selection. However, they wondered out loud why they didn't raise entry to the Hall years ago.

# Yale Coach Resigns

New Haven, Conn.—UPI—Yale University officials may not have to roam too far afield in seeking a new head football coach.

Jordan Olivar presumably caught the Eli athletic office by surprise Monday night when he announced he was relinquishing what amounted to a lifetime contract as Yale coach to devote all his time to his insurance business in Beverly Hills, Calif.

There had been reports that the 48-year-old native New Yorker was considering resigning at the end of the 1962 season when the Elis won only two of nine games. However, athletic director DeJancy Kibbutz said no steps had been taken to find a successor because it had been hoped Olivar would change his mind.

But when Olivar made it official Monday night, at least four men automatically became leading candidates for his job. They were assistant coaches Harry Jaemuski, Jerry Neri and Art Paimo, and veteran defensive end Andy Robustelli of the New York Giants.

# NBA Will Stay With 9 Teams

New York—UPI—The National Basketball Association will go along with nine clubs next season, but left room for a Baltimore franchise if a team wishes to change its base of operations.

NBA president Maurice Podoloff said the league's board of governors found "no sentiment for expansion at this time" at a meeting Monday.

Podoloff said the clubs will be asked to submit a report at the annual meeting on May 1 and to state if they wish to remain at their present home city.
