

Lakeview Subdues Eagles; Henley, IV, SM Win Rogue Tilts

Henley High school's Rogue basketball leadership was bolstered on Friday night when the state No. 1 A-2 rated aggregation polished off Rogue River 73 to 50 and Lakeview out-tossed defending Rogue 63 to 55.

The encounters gave the Hornets a two-game bulge over its nearest challengers as the Honkers of Lakeview pulled into a second place tie with the Eagles.

Illinois Valley held to its fourth position by thumping Sacred Heart 83 to 45 and St. Mary's assumed sixth spot alone by rallying past Phoenix 42 to 38.

Kent Gooding and Mike Beymer had enough points between them to outscore Rogue River. Gooding tossed in 27 and Beymer 24. Jack Salter had 17 and Tom Davidson 13 for Rogue River.

Henley garnered 18 to 7 quarter and 40 to 23 halftime leads but RR cut its deficit to 44 to 37 before the Hornets stretched to a third quarter halt standing of 50 to 38.

Lakeview outshot and out-tossed Eagle Point and took advantage of Eagle defensive woes. The Honkers had 12 to 11, 29 to 22 and 46 to 39 margins at the quarters. They got 16 points from Larry Samples, 14 from Dan Leahy and 12 from Dennis Warren.

John Linder had 15 for EP and Charles Pomeroy and Richard Short 13 each. Each team made 21 field goals as Lakeview fired at an average of 368 and Eagle Point at 292. Lakeview put

in 21 of 31 free attempts and Eagle Point 13 of 24. Eagle Point compiled a rebound difference of 55 to 34 with Pomeroy and Short each making 16 retrieves. Fred Williams had 11 for Lakeview.

St. Mary's surged by Phoenix in the final minutes after lagging once by 14 points and then by 33 to 24 going into the last quarter. The Crusaders outscored Phoenix 13 to 1 over the last 4½ minutes as the held the Pirates to just five points in the closing panel while getting 18 themselves.

John Batzer netted a jumper from the slot to give SM a 39 to 38 nod with 2:21 to play. The Medford team got the ball and tried to hold it but lost it on a free throw time violation. Phoenix attempted to play for one sure shot but lost the ball on a missed free heave. Batzer was fouled and made two gifts. He then rebounded a missed Pirate field effort and, fouled at the buzzer, added two more points.

Phoenix was in front 7 to 6 at the quarter and 26 to 16 at the half. Widest spread was 26 to 12. The Crusaders employed a press throughout the final half to overtake the Pirates.

SM closed the third quarter bulge to 33 to 28 on baskets by Dave Young and Jim Calhoun. A Dave Johnson free point and Rick Bolz jumper made 36 to 28. Ron Roberts of SM and Bolz exchanged charity tosses. Two goals by Young and one each by Randy Corliss and Roberts closed the gap to 38 to 37.

Young had 12 points for SM and Corliss 10. John Barker totaled 11 for Phoenix and Jon Granby 10. SM shot 320 from the field and had 17 field buckets to 11 for Phoenix. The Pirates led in free heaves 16 to 8.

St. Mary's rebound difference was 42 to 30. IV outboarded Sacred Heart with 24 to 14, 40 to 19 and 61 to 32 period gaps. Darryl Gellert put in 24 points for the Cougars, 17 in the first canto. Pete Krok was high man for the Trojans with 17.

Illinois Valley, casting 79 shots hit .391 from the field while SH was getting .312. Cougar rebound difference was 52 to 30.

Jayvee games were won by Phoenix 49 to 45, Illinois Valley 42 to 35 and Henley 65 to 39 and by Lakeview. Phoenix had 14 to 10, 26 to 18 and 38 to 25 margins at the rests and Dale Sauer tallied 19 points. Mike Soran put in 10 for St. Mary's. Gregg Petsch led IV with 14.

Grants Pass — Grants Pass high won a ragged, foul-filled Southern Oregon conference basketball scuffle here Friday night by 61 to 55.

The verdict assured the Cavemen of no less than a tie for second place in the conference standings after Saturday play. Grants Pass, now 5-3, had no game last night.

Ashland, which topped 14 to 9, 24 to 22 and 43 to 41 at the quarters, fired only 38 tries from the field as fouls and lost balls reduced the number of goal attempts. Grants Pass took 48 field shots.

A total of 62 personal infractions were blown by officials Don Sutphin and Jim Beechli, 32 on Ashland and 27 on GP. Ashland lost Dale and Gale Tepper, Rick Pierce and Tod Hess on fouls and Tom Sparlin. Al Hutchins and Bob Shepard were banished from the Caveman crew.

Jim Pippin scored 21 points for the Cavemen and Hutchins 20. Dean Samuelson had 18 for Ashland, 12 from the free throw line.

Ashland, as of Friday, was 0-7 for league play. Grants Pass also won the junior varsity and sophomore games by respective counts of 52 to 40 and 54 to 38.

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AAU, NCAA In Dispute Once More

New York—UPI—The uneasy truce between the AAU and NCAA appeared near an end Saturday after only 12 days, with the possibility Gen. Douglas MacArthur may have to be called on again to settle the latest wrangle between the two groups.

MacArthur temporarily restored peace on Jan. 19 with a four-point agreement plan but a new dispute suddenly arose between both factions Friday over the sanctioning of open track and field meets.

Actually, the AAU and NCAA were supposed to sign a peace treaty Friday but wound up in disagreement instead over interpretation of MacArthur's so-called articles of alliance.

Claim Dual Rights
The AAU assumed it would have sole sanctioning powers in open meets but officials of the NCAA supported U.S. Track and Field federation apparently felt the general's plan empowered them with dual sanctioning rights.

The matter came to a head recently when several colleges, including members of the far west Big Six conference, refused to permit their athletes to compete in open meets unless the USTFF, as well as the AAU, granted sanctioning privileges.

There is a reluctance on the part of both the AAU and NCAA to run to MacArthur with every problem that arises but in his agreement plan the general said his decision would be final in case of any further controversy.
