

Need of Blood by Two Valley Residents Noted by Red Cross

The Jackson County Chapter of the American Red Cross was alerted this week to the need for blood by two valley residents.

Mrs. E. W. Seggesman, honorary life member of the Red Cross since 1924, is now confined to Sacred Heart hospital where she will undergo orthopedic surgery.

Mrs. Seggesman was injured in an automobile accident in British Columbia a year ago. She was hospitalized there for two months then flown to Medford by Mercy Flights, Inc., and admitted to Sacred Heart hospital, where she remained for

an additional three months. She has been in and out of the hospital throughout the summer and fall and on one occasion was transported to Portland by Mercy Flights for consultation, the Red Cross noted. She was re-admitted to the hospital here a month ago and will undergo a spinal fusion surgical procedure shortly, it added.

The amount of blood needed by Mrs. Seggesman has not been determined; however, past experience would indicate that several units will be needed during and after surgery.

Always active in community affairs, Mrs. Segges-

man has served as chairman of the Shady Cove Blood Bank since it was first formed several years ago. Her present illness has made it necessary for her to leave this post.

Home Service Volunteer

She also has served as a home service volunteer and has continued to serve in this capacity intermittently during her illness. She anticipates resuming her position in this service following surgery, the Red Cross noted.

Mrs. Abner O. Clark has requested assistance in obtaining replacement donors for blood administered to her father, J. L. McCollum, during his recent hospitalization

in the Veteran's hospital in Portland.

McCollum underwent surgery there shortly before Christmas and is now recuperating at the Hawthorne Convalescent hospital in Medford. Ten pints of blood are needed to replace that used for McCollum during his hospitalization, and donors are advised that they may give in his name during the next visit of the Red Cross Bloodmobile.

HITS NAVY SPENDING

Washington—(UPI)—The General Accounting Office said the Navy overspent \$408,000 for aircraft engine bearings because it wouldn't let the Air Force make the purchase for it on competitive bids. The GAO said the purchases late in 1961 totaled \$1,145,000 for more than 8,000 bearings. It said the prices paid by the Navy ranged from \$28 to \$52 more per unit than the Air Force paid for the same items.

In Merchantile Business

Having been in the merchantile business in Montana, Mr. and Mrs. McCollum resided in various areas throughout the valley, including Phoenix, Ashland and Medford. McCollum's residence, prior to hospitaliza-

tion, was at 6845 Rogue River highway.

Persons may donate blood in the names of either Mrs. Seggesman or McCollum, or the name of any person or organization they wish during the Bloodmobile visit next week, the Red Cross noted.

Hours for the Bloodmobile visit at the Red Cross chapter house in Medford, 60 Hawthorne ave., will be Monday from 2 to 6 p.m. and Tuesday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The Bloodmobile will not visit Ashland this trip, but instead will be at the Jewett school in Central Point Wednesday from 3 to 7 p.m. Transportation and baby sitters will be available.
