BF Going On Klamath County Trip

Butte Falls High's Loggers this week end will get an idea of what their prospects are once the District 5B basketball tournament rolls around.

They invade Klamath county for games against the No. 1 and 2 teams in the county B loop race.

Butte Falls vies at Merrill on Friday night and at Chiloquin Saturday evening.

The Loggers have a 14-1 season record, they consider themselves the underdogs on this trip.

Merrill is 7-2 for its league and 7-5 for the season. One of its non-league foes was Henley, No. 1 rated A-2 team in the state.

Chiloquin is 9-0 in the circuit and 12-1 for 1962-1963 with its only setback at the hands of Henley.

In league play Chiloquin has tipped Merrill's Huskies by five and four points.

Chiloquin's Panthers have averaged around 48 points per game and Chiloquin about 55.

Butte Falls has a 50 per game rate.

Merrill and Chiloquin reportedly will exceed Butte Falls in overall team height.

Butte Falls, however, has the tallest man in Bob Copeland, 6-5, top rebounder and second high logger scorer.

Neal Ellis is the leading point maker for the Loggers.
