Woman Who Bruises Easily

Dozens of women, usually past middle age, want to know why every so often they find a black and blue spot, perhaps on the outside of one thigh. They want to know if this indicates a disease, or if they just bruise easily. I often puzzle over this. If a woman with this problem comes into the office, I always have her blood studied to make sure that she has nothing seriously wrong, especially with the clotting mechanism of the blood.

Dupuytren's Contracture

If it gets to be a nuisance, it can usually be removed by a surgeon, preferably an orthopedist, who after lifting up the skin of the palm will dissect out and remove the contracted strip of fibrous tissue which is pulling on the fingers.

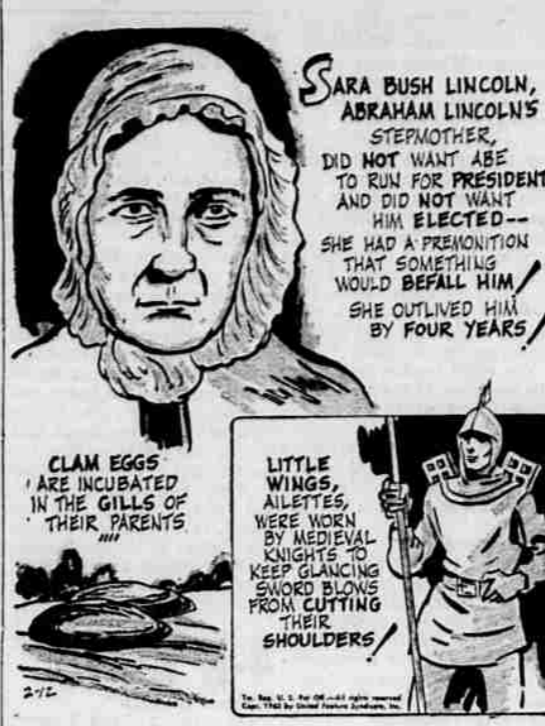
MOO-O-OS and MUSINGS
