U. S. Turns Down Soviet Ultimatum

Geneva, (UPI)—The United States has rejected Soviet ultimatum tactics and told the 17-nation disarmament conference it now has doubts whether the Kremlin really wants a nuclear test ban treaty.

U.S. chief negotiator William C. Foster said recent Soviet behavior here and in nuclear talks with Britain and America "has shaken our belief that the Soviet Union really desires agreement."

Foster said that when Russia first accepted the principle of on-site inspection for policing a test ban "we did not assume a number (two to three years) mentioned by Chairman (Soviet Premier Nikita) Khrushchev to be an ultimatum which the U.S. had no choice but to accept."

The Soviets have told the conference here their offer of two to three inspections—as against Western insistence on 8 to 10 inspections—is a take-it-or-leave-it offer.

Laos Tension Felt Near Danger Point

Vientiane, Laos, (UPI)—Tension between rival factions mounted toward the danger point in Laos today and officials warned that new fighting might break the country's uneasy peace.

Neutralist and pro-Communist Pathet Lao forces, on "alert" status, faced each other in defensive positions in the strategic Plain of Jars where they once fought as allies against the U.S.-backed right-wing forces in the civil war.

Maida U. — Now that his job has ended, she has no use for him.

Mrs. G. U. — Now I realize what a dull stupid fellow he is.

Maida U. — Late in life my brother was foolish enough to marry a spinster of 55. He was a traveling man, running errands all over the country for his firm, but he was nearing retirement age and he wanted to settle down. As for her, she just wanted to have her name changed, get the title of "Mrs." and a wedding ring. Because, as it turns out, she acts as though she can't stand having him around.

It hurts me to see what lies ahead for my brother. Maybe The Council can tell my sister-in-law a thing or two on what marriage means and how to treat a husband.

Mrs. G. U. — When a woman my age changes the whole pattern of her life she certainly expects it to be a big improvement, else she'd leave matters as is. Two years before he retired my husband painted a glorious picture for me. He had friends all over the world, he said, and if I married him we'd be companions on interesting trips, and establish a little home to rest up in, in between our jaunts. He was tired of furnished rooms, he said, and didn't want to move in with his sister.

While he continued to work, I went ahead with my end of the bargain. We were married and he moved into my apartment. And that's all. He has no friends, there are no trips. He just sits around. Now that I have such a steady diet of his company I realize how empty and boring he really is.

It's obvious that each of these middle-age "contractors" threw a bit of powder in the other's eyes, in the form of little white lies. To get what each wanted, she a "marital status," he a "home port," they portrayed selves which just didn't, and still don't, exist.

Because he was away so much, his wife never really knew him and now, rather than bother, she dismisses him as "boring."
