

Bearcats Top Rating Despite 1st Loss; OSU Drop to 13th

New York —(AP)— Cincinnati's first defeat failed to shake the Bearcats from the No. 1 spot in the United Press International college basketball ratings today, but Loyola, whose perfect record also was ruined, was replaced by Duke in second place.

Wichita vaulted all the way from 17th place to sixth this week on the strength of the 65-64 upset victory which ended Cincinnati's 37-game, two-season winning streak. Although Cincinnati held the top spot — as it has every week of this season — coach Ed Jucker's Bearcats missed

unanimous acclaim for the first time in nine weeks. One member of the 35-man UPI Board of Coaches cast his first-place vote for Duke, leaving Cincinnati just one point short of a perfect score. Duke, which has a 19-2 record and has won 13 straight games, thus moved up another notch in its steady climb from 10th place during the past eight weeks. The Blue Devils, undefeated in 12 Atlantic Coast conference games, were third behind Cincinnati and Loyola for the three previous weeks. Loyola, whose 21-game winning streak was snapped by Bowling Green, 92-75, last

Saturday night, dropped out of the runnerup spot which it had held for eight consecutive weeks. The Ramblers from Chicago were third, 13 points behind Duke and 69 behind Cincinnati. Arizona State moved up a notch to fourth place, as Illinois dropped to fifth; Ohio State moved back into the top 10 group and tied Stanford for seventh. Colorado and Georgia Tech rounded out this week's top 10 group. The coaches based their ratings on games played through Saturday night, Feb. 16. Mississippi State, seventh last week, dropped to 11th place, and Oregon State fell from 10th to 13th. New York University was between them in 12th place.

The bill would extend from 10 to 60 days the waiting period before the State Liquor Control Commission can shut period.

Salem — (AP) — Rep. Carroll Howe, (R-Klamath Falls), said Monday compulsory year-round school and college programs would have a serious impact on Oregon's economy. Howe said the state would suffer from loss of student workers during the peak-employment summer months. He said such key industries as lumber, fire control, construction, agriculture and tourist businesses need larger work forces during the summer. Howe, former superintendent of Klamath county schools, said students also would suffer under a compulsory program. He said many students now finance their education by summer work.

Denny Moyer To Defend Title Tonight

Honolulu — (AP) — Denny Moyer, reportedly having weight problems, makes his first defense of the world junior middleweight title tonight when he faced Honolulu's Stan Harrington. The state Boxing Commission Monday turned down the Portland, Ore. champ's request to hold the weigh-in two hours earlier than stipulated in the contract. It is set for 1 p.m., HST 6 p.m., EST today. Moyer had asked to go on the scales at 11 a.m., local time.

The limit is 154 pounds. It will be Moyer's first defense of the crown since he won it from the veteran Joey Giambra last October. Promoter Sam Ichonense said he expects a capacity crowd of 5,000 at Civic Auditorium for Hawaii's first championship bout in 10 years. The fight is scheduled to start at 2 a.m., EST.
