

South Africa Is Subject of Talk

South Africa is a land of amazing contrasts. Deanne Dayton, Grants Pass girl who recently returned from a year's study at Rhodes university in the Republic of South Africa, said in an address here Tuesday.

Speaking before the Medford Rotary club at a luncheon meeting at the Rogue Valley Country Club, Miss Dayton said that alongside a fine university in a South African city could be found areas of extreme poverty.

Here the people are segregated into so-called "locations" and the separation is total. The Africans, however, are wonderful and are vitally concerned with the future of their country.

The speaker talked with refugees from the Congo and observed that much of the troubles today in that area is due to the unsettled condition of dislocated people. South Africa is a young country with growing pains; resembles greatly the U.S. mid-west country.

The cry of Africa for Africans does not take into consideration the fact that Europeans were first in the southern area and have every right to remain. There are, Miss Dayton observed, 15 million people living in South Africa. Education of the latter is a long process which accounts for the fact that today we see a highly developed European civilization side-by-side with primitive native culture.

Deanne Dayton graduated from Pacific university at Forest Grove, and studied in South Africa on a Rotary Foundation Fellowship.
