District Wrestling Tournament Here on Friday, Saturday

Approximately 130 boys will contend Friday and Saturday, Feb. 22 and 23, in the District 6 A-1 wrestling tournament here.

OTI Downs Raiders In Offensive Tilt

Ashland - Oregon Technical institute powered its way to a high scoring defenseless 111-93 basketball conquest of Southern Oregon college's Red Raiders here Tuesday night.

Using their greater height to full advantage and having one of their hottest nights from the floor, the Owls of OTI took late first half lead and held it for the remainder of the contest.

SOC lost the opening tip from Royce Kiser and Hewlett Nash of OTI took it for the first score. The Raiders retaliated with two from the key but lost the lead as Nash and Sammie Smith scored. Oregon Tech held the lead three minutes. Jerry Shults and Dave Hughes brought the home court men to a 10-10 tie. Once again the Owls regained advantage of SOC with their fast floor play and exceptional shooting.

Score Knotted
Southern Oregon brought the encounter to a knot more than once during the remaining minutes of the first period but lacked the strength to go out ahead. The Raiders last scoring challenge came in the last two minutes of the opening half. Dave Hughes hit with a hook under the bucket to carry Southern Oregon to a 44-44 tie.

At this point of the battle OTI's Smith followed a free throw in and came out with a bucket for the Owls.

The second half was pretty well the visitors as they collected the first bucket and set off on a long scoring drive. Final 18-point margin was the winner of the game.

OTI's 27 points at the free line to SOC's 13 made most of the scoring difference of the game. For the Raiders shot a bit hotter from the field but not quite so much as the Owls. Southern Oregon hit 40 of 81 tries from the field for .494. Oregon Tech fired 472 on 42 of 89.

Anderson Scores

The Owls had 35 to 27 backboard retrieving edge. Both clubs lost the ball on rebounds to result in the low figure.

Willie Anderson led OTI point production with 35. Van Zitek had 22, Norm Johnson 21 and Hewlett Nash 19.

SOC's Dave Hughes was second high in points with 32. Brad Flanary had 16.

This was SOC's last game of the season and seniors Hughes and Flanary both ended their Raider hoop careers. Hughes has averaged 16.7 points per game this season.

Oregon college topped Portland State 68-57 in the other Oregon Collegiate conference game in Portland to clinch second place with a 9-5 record and two games remaining. The Wolves won the right to meet the Northwest conference champion for a berth in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics tournament in Kansas City, Mo. Oregon Tech is ineligible for that tournament.

Seven Teams To Participate In AAU Tourney

Seven teams will be entered in the District AAU basketball tourney at Hedrick gym here on Sunday, the city recreation department has announced.

The single elimination event will open at 9 a.m. Pairings have not yet been announced.

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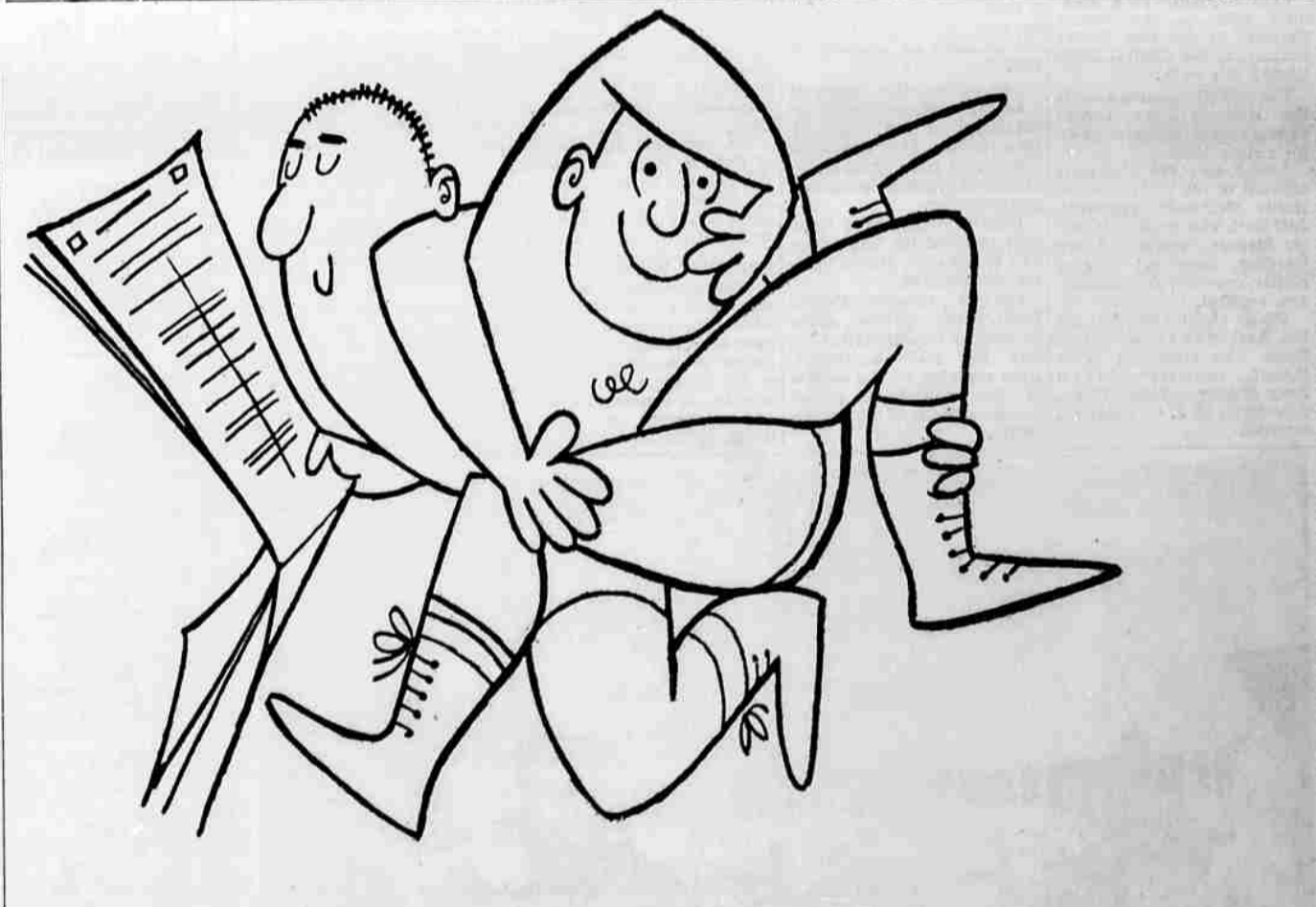
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
