

Kennedys To Limit Reporter Activity At Social Affairs

Washington—UPI—The White House said Wednesday it is taking a leaf from the Eisenhower administration's notebook concerning press coverage of President and Mrs. Kennedy's social events.

Press Secretary Pierre Salinger said the administration has decided to change the way reporters have been allowed to cover White House parties for the past two years in favor of the policy followed by the Eisenhower administration.

Reporter Pool
Salinger said that from now on reporters will be covered by a pool of reporters who will be permitted to witness the arrival of guests and

the Kennedys. They also will be allowed to observe the receiving line.

The question of coverage came up at Salinger's briefing Wednesday when a reporter asked the "current status of negotiations of onsite inspection of diplomatic receptions."

The first lady's press secretary, Pamela Turnure, announced Tuesday a clampdown on reporters at social events. She told wire services later, however, that she had "misinterpreted" the situation.

Salinger declined to give any reason why Kennedy and the first lady have decided to

curtail coverage of their parties.

Since the Kennedys came into the White House, reporters have been allowed to cover the receptions from beginning to end and to mix with the guests. At formal dinner parties they have been

allowed to come in late in the evening to cover the entertainment in the East Room.

Salinger was asked, "Is this part of the new policy of managed news?"

No Food Shortages Expected This Year

Salinger also was asked to comment on an irate statement from Rep. Abner W. Sibal (R-Conn.), who said "The Kennedys are not the owners of the White House. Sibal said 'The American people own it and are interested in who is being wined and dined there by the first family.'"

Salinger said he had not seen the comment.

Sources said Mrs. Kennedy for some time has wanted to ban reporters from mixing with guests at social affairs. The President's wife, it was said, feels that newsmen take away from the relaxed atmosphere of her parties.

Mrs. Kennedy also is said to feel that reporters should not interview her guests.
