New British Cruiser Going Into Mothballs

London — UPI — The Admiralty announced Thursday it's newest, most expensive cruiser is going into mothballs because the Royal Navy cannot raise a crew for it.

The \$42 million Blake, 13 months at sea, was mothballed because "naval manpower is tremendously under strain," according to the Admiralty. Construction of the 9,550 ton cruiser began in 1942 and it has sailed only 39,124 miles since being commissioned.

Kennedy Relaxes At Florida Estate

Palm Beach, Fla. — UPI — President Kennedy relaxed with his family in an ocean front estate today and planned an easy-going celebration of the birth of the first of his predecessors in office.

The Chief Executive and Mrs. Kennedy arrived from frigid Washington late Thursday night for a long Washington birthday week end in the mild south Florida weather.

If forecasts of sunshine held up, Kennedy hoped to go yachting in local waters and to have a swim in the heated pool of his borrowee estate. He also planned to visit his father, 74-year-old Joseph P. Kennedy, convalescing from the paralytic stroke he suffered here in December, 1961.

Kennedy's military aide, Maj. Gen. Chester V. Clifton, was on hand to keep the President briefed on developments surrounding the attack on an American shrimp boat Wednesday by Russian-made jet fighters from Cuba.
