Maiden Sinking Is Made by Small Sub

Tiburon, Calif. — (UPI) — A midget, two-man submarine topped off its maiden week Saturday with its maiden sinking.

The \$9,000 sub, designed to investigate marine life in San Francisco Bay, turned turtle and sank in 14 feet of water while 25 spectators and a television camera watched.

On board were driver Bob Kiwala of the federal Fish and Wildlife Service and television newsmen Al Mann of Los Angeles. Both escaped.

The 12-foot craft made a circular run and had returned to the dock when Mann started to hop off the sub and onto the dock. He, Kiwala and the sub went to the bottom.

He and Kiwala resurfaced on the surface.

Robbery Suspect Takes Wrong Car

San Francisco — (UPI) — George R. Dunkly, 42, was in jail as a robbery suspect today because he took the wrong street car.

Trolley motorman Rex Keller recognized Dunkly as a man who robbed him of \$50 last month and handed this note Sunday to a departing passenger: "There is a robbery suspect on this car. Please call police."

The unidentified passenger obeyed, police intercepted the trolley, and took the startled Dunkly into custody.

San Diego, Calif. — (UPI) — Mrs. Sarah Olchon of Youngstown, Ohio, decided to visit her son and his wife, whom she had never met, and suggested a brass band greet her.

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Mansfield Says Critics of JFK Aware of Position

Washington — (UPI) — Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield said today Republican critics of President Kennedy's Cuban policy knew that "under certain conditions he is prepared to take certain drastic actions."

The Montana senator did not elaborate. He made the statement in an interview when asked about reports that Senate GOP Leader Everett M. Dirksen, Ill., had told Kennedy that Republicans would continue to attack the administration on the Cuban issue.

Mansfield's comments followed these developments: Sen. Hugh Scott (R-Pa.) called for a total quarantine of Cuba except for food. He said this would "get rid of the Russians" on the island.

Support Arms Blockade
Gonzalo J. Facio, chairman of the Council of the Organization of American States, said he believed the OAS would support a complete arms blockade of Cuba.

Rep. Stanley R. Tupper, (R-Maine) one of eight U.S. lawmakers who returned from a week end visit to Guantanamo, Cuba, naval base, said he believed there were no long-range Soviet missiles stored in Cuban caves because no roads had been built to the caves.

Mansfield said the President was "not fearful" of GOP criticism but that "if fault is to be found it would be the American thing to do to offer alternatives of a constructive nature."

"I am sure that the Republicans are fully aware of the fact that President Kennedy is doing everything in his power to lessen the danger from Cuba caused by the stationing of Russian troops and technicians there," Mansfield said.

"I am sure that they are fully aware of the fact that under certain conditions he is prepared to take certain drastic actions."

Mansfield said the Republicans also knew that Kennedy had to consider difficult situations in Berlin, Western Europe, the Middle East, South Asia, Southeast Asia, for moslem, and Korea as well as in Cuba and Latin America.

He said that regardless of what "some of them may say on the surface, deep down they are fully aware that the President's first concern—and this would apply to any president — is the welfare and security of this country."

College Buildings Destroyed by Fire

Macon, Ga. — (UPI) — Fire destroyed several buildings of historic Wesleyan college and three nearby apartment buildings Sunday, forcing the removal of hundreds of persons.

More than 30 families were left homeless and four persons suffered minor injuries. Damage was estimated unofficially at more than \$100,000.

Wesleyan college, constructed in 1837, was the first chartered women's college in the United States. A new campus has been constructed on the outskirts of Macon.
