Washington Bill Eliminates Authority

Olympia, Wash. — (UPI) — The Senate has passed and sent to the House a bill eliminating the authority of judges to waive the three-day waiting period for marriages.

The measure was approved 32-15 Saturday.

An amendment tacked on the bill would permit applications for marriage licenses to be made by mail when the applications are notarized.

Sen. Perry Woodall (R-Tennessee) a sponsor of the bill, said many hours of judicial time are spent on the problem of waiving the three-day waiting period required before couples can be married.

Washington Residents Limited on Fishing

Olympia, Wash. — (UPI) — A bill making it illegal for Washington residents to fish for salmon in the Pacific Ocean with other than angling or trolling gear was passed by the House Saturday and sent to the Senate.

If approved by the legislature, the law would not go into effect unless similar statutes were passed by Alaska, Oregon and California.

Civil War Officer Honored in House

Salem — (UPI) — Col. E. D. Baker, the first union officer to die in the Civil War, was honored on the House floor here Monday by Rep. Clinton Haight (D-Baker).

Haight noted his own part of Oregon was named for the colonel, who was one of Oregon's first U.S. senators prior to the civil war.
