**ASSASSINATION ATTEMPT CHARGED**  
Bangkok, Thailand—Police announced today the arrest of two men charged with plotting to assassinate Premier Sarit Thanarat.

**ABORTION STATISTICS REVEALED**  
Vienna—There were 53 abortions for every 100 babies born in Czechoslovakia last year, according to official radio Bratislava. A week and broadcast expressed serious concern over the abortion rate. A total of more than 115,000 abortions were officially recorded last year, the radio said.

**OFFICIAL RETURNS FROM CONFERENCE**  
London—Deputy Labor Party Leader George Brown returned to London yesterday from Paris where he conferred with leaders of the Western European Union and NATO. He said he had received "interesting" information but declined to elaborate on it immediately. Brown indicated he will disclose the information in the House of Commons next week.

**SEATO MINISTERS TO CONVENE**  
Bangkok, Thailand—The council of ministers of the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO) will convene in Paris on April 8-10, according to an announcement here. SEATO Secretary General Pote Sarasin announced the meeting, the first in two years for the council. SEATO members are the United States, Britain, France, Australia, New Zealand, Thailand, Pakistan and the Philippines.

## Move Made to Check Casualties

Saigon, Viet Nam—U.S. military sources said the new "rules of engagement" will permit the U.S. Army's new HUI gas turbine helicopters to open fire on "positively identified" guerrillas without waiting to be fired on first as heretofore. The sources said the effectiveness of the heavily armed craft known by their crews as "Hueys" in protecting the more vulnerable H21 troop carrying helicopters is expected to increase under the new rules.

**MEASURES APPROVED**  
Portland—The Portland school board Monday night approved two measures for submission at an April 26 election. They call for a \$12.5 million five-year building levy and a \$5 million two-year special operational levy.

## Nominees for Academy Awards Told

Hollywood—U.S. Bette Davis, who only recently was advertising in Hollywood for a movie job, today was an Academy Award nominee for the best actress of 1962. Miss Davis, a two-time Oscar winner, was nominated Monday for the tenth time, more than any other star. Her nomination came for "What Ever Happened to Baby Jane?" a film she has described as a "modest little picture."

Also nominated as best actress were Katharine Hepburn, "Long Day's Journey Into Night," Anne Bancroft, "The Miracle Worker," Geraldine Page, "Sweet Bird of Youth" and Lee Remick, "Days of Wine and Roses." Miss Hepburn won an Oscar 30 years ago for "Morning Glory." The nomination of Miss Davis, who had previously advertised for acting work in a movie trade magazine, sharply contrasted to the defeated attitude she expressed only a few weeks ago. "No woman has been more defeated personally and professionally than I've been for the past 10 years," she said. "I call them the black years—10 years of nothing."

**Best Actor Nominees**  
Chosen as nominees for best actor were previous winner Burt Lancaster, (Bird Man of Alcatraz), Jack Lemmon (Days of Wine and Roses), Peter O'Toole (Lawrence of Arabia), Gregory Peck (To Kill a Mockingbird) and Marcello Mastroianni (Divorce—Italian Style).

**Millionaires Said Hardest Workers**  
London—U.S. Jean Paul Getty, one of the richest men in the world, believes millionaires are the hardest-working people in the world. "They work longer hours than any other working man," the 70-year-old oil king said Sunday night on a television interview on the British Broadcasting Corp. "But that doesn't mean Getty is ready to retire. 'I've never had the feeling I'm flushed,' he said. 'I'm struggling on.'"

**Pope's Message To Be Broadcast Feb. 27**  
Wednesday, Feb. 27, the Ash Wednesday message and blessing to American children by Pope John XXIII, will be broadcast over radio station KYJC at 9:10 a.m. The message and blessing will be read by Archbishop Patrick A. O'Boyle, archbishop of Washington and chairman of the administrative board of bishops of the National Catholic Welfare conference.

**Congressman Urges Income Tax Repeal**  
Washington—Rep. Thomas M. Pelly (R-Wash.) observed the 50th anniversary of the constitutional amendment permitting an income tax Monday by calling for its repeal. Pelly told the House that repeal of the 16th Amendment would make the economy "hum" and sharply cut unemployment.

New York—U.S. Buyers came out of hiding shortly after a lower stock market opening today, bringing prices back toward prior closing levels. Most autos, steels, oils and chemicals were little changed after starting minus fractions. Rails and utilities were little changed and featureless.
