

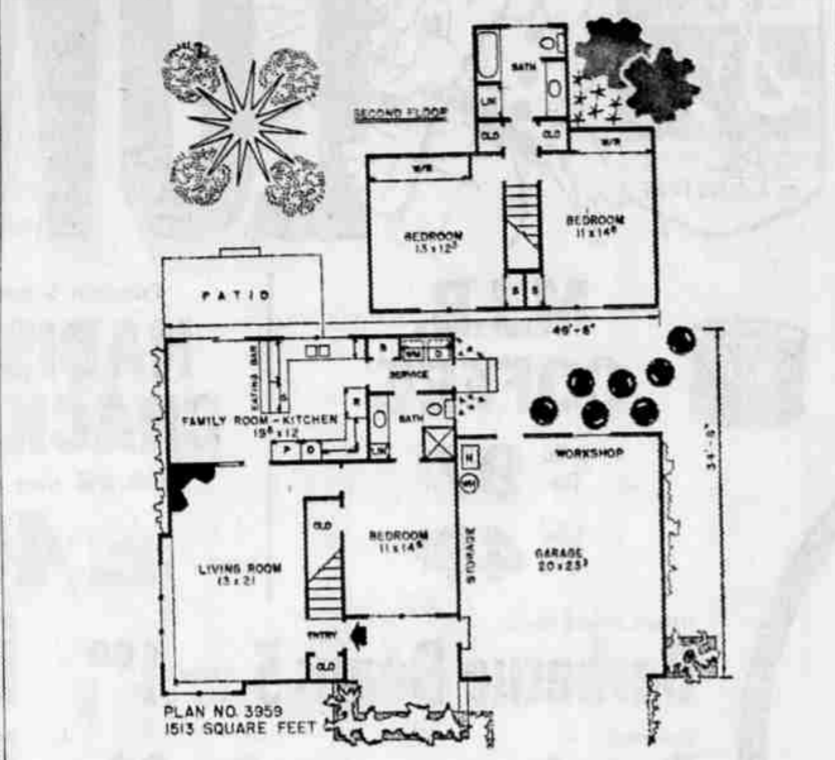
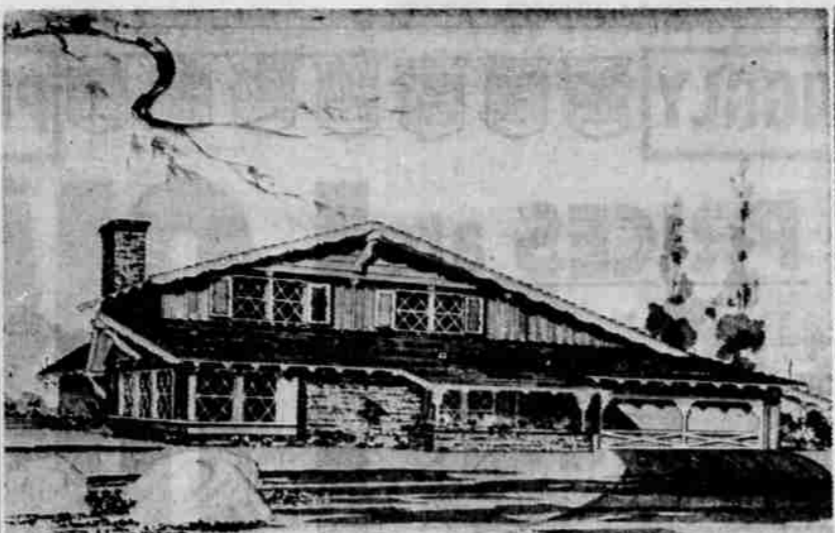

### This Week's Plan for Home Builders

The one and one-half story home is not a thing of the past. In fact, this style home is becoming more and more popular.

It is often the most economical house to build in areas where land values have become so high. Here you have all the advantages of second floor bedrooms but with an exciting exterior design that seems to hug the ground.

There's a world of modern-day conveniences in this practical dream home. Especially note the unusual size of all rooms which has been achieved in just a little over 1,500 square feet.

There is access from the entry to a guest closet the second floor and the huge living room. A large bay with a bank of five windows plus a huge corner fireplace are the fascinating highlights of this room.

A partial wall with turned posts above separates the living and family rooms. By opening the sliding glass doors leading to the patio, the family room is almost doubled in size. An eating bar plus other cabinets separate the kitchen and family room.

The kitchen is one of the most pleasant spots in the house to spend time. It is part of the family activity center and has a constant view of the garden and patio. By proper planning, the wide pantry will eliminate many extra shopping trips.

The downstairs bath is accessible from the bedroom and the service. Both this bath and the upstairs bath feature a pullman lavatory and a linen closet.

The two large upstairs bedrooms are luxurious in size and offer an unusual amount of storage space. Each of these bedrooms has a built-in storage closet above the stairs. Two additional closets open to the hall.

The furnace and water heater are in the oversized garage. There is also space for storage and a workshop. One door has been conveniently located at the rear of the garage while another opens to the roofed front porch.

An extensive amount of creative planning has been necessary to produce this charming and distinctive exterior. Band sawn barge boards trim each gable. Used brick has been used in the chimney as veneer and in the planter. Corbels are located under that part of each gable which projects past the exterior wall to form a more interesting and unique exterior. Beams supported by corbels protrude from the top of each gable.

### The Medical Roundup

#### When Father Suffers A Bad Stroke

Today, a common and often bitter complaint is made by families whose wishes were ignored by the physician when their father, or mother, suffered a bad stroke. When the stroke occurred — especially if it happened to a parent who for some time had been so ill and senile that he was only a burden to himself and everyone who had to take care of him — the family wanted him to be left in his own bed at home, and they wanted to wait a day or two to see if he would show any sign of rallying.

But the doctor called for an ambulance and rushed the old man to a hospital, where for 3 or 4 days, the doctor made dozens of laboratory tests and tried out all sorts of treatments. Then the man died, as any wise doctor could have prophesied he would, and the family received first a huge hospital bill, and then a huge doctor bill which cleaned out their bank account.

I thought of these families as I read the report of a careful study made by Drs. E. S. Cooper, Johannes Ipsen, and H. Dale Bowen of Philadelphia. Their paper ought to be read and memorized by doctors all over the country, because they show clearly that if, after a bad stroke, the person is sleepy, it is a bad sign; if he is very sleepy, it is a worse sign, and if he is in a "coma" (unconscious) he will probably die, no matter what is done.

I do hope that if I ever get a bad stroke, the doctor will not put a tube into my nose and will not puncture me all over to give medicines and to get blood for a hundred tests. I hope someone will be around to protect me, and let me die in peace. I hope that if I am speechless, badly paralyzed and much of my mind gone, I will be permitted to go: I hope no one tries to drag out my suffering for a few days or weeks or months. If after my big stroke I get a pneumonia, I will not want to be cured of it.

If, however, after a few weeks, much of my paralysis is gone, my speech is coming back and my mind is working well, I will want to have help from a physiotherapist to keep my muscles in good condition, and a speech therapist is to help me to learn to talk again.

Not all strokes produce dramatic and noticeable symptoms. You will understand strokes better if you read Dr. Alvarez' little booklet, "Little Strokes."
