'Gap' in Human Evolution Given Scientific Name

Washington — (UPI) — A 14-million-year-old fossil unearthed in Africa by explorers of the "gap" in human evolution now has a name: "Kenyanthropus Wickeri."

British anthropologist Louis S. B. Leakey, writing in the "National Geographic" magazine, said the fossil fills "an enormous gap in the panorama of man's development."

Since finding the jawbone of an unknown primate during a 1961 dig in Kenya, Leakey and his wife have had a chance to study its characteristics and give it its scientific name, Kenyanthropus Wickeri.

Explaining the name, Leakey said "Kenya, of course, indicates where the fossils were found, and pithecus is one of the endings frequently used in describing the higher primates of prehistoric times. Honors Friend."

"The last part of the name, Wickeri, honors my friend Fred Wicker, an orange grower at Fort Ternan, who found the first fossil where Kenyanthropus was later discovered."

Anthropologists avoid using the term "missing link" in piecing together the story of human evolution.

Leakey said Kenyanthropus "was not—emphatically not—a man."

But he said it had an essential characteristic of present-day man, one never found in the same form among fossil or living apes or monkeys. It is what scientists call a "canine fossa." This, in humans, is a depression in the upper jaw that anchors a muscle which helps control lip movements of speech.

No Information
Leakey said "Until the discovery of Kenyanthropus, we had literally no information from Africa about any stage of man in that vast stretch of time" between Proconsul and its related stock of some 25 to 40 million years ago and the Olduvai creatures who lived a little less than 2 million years ago.

"There were only a few fossils elsewhere in the world from that period, and those allied in the direction of apes, not a man" he said. "Now at least we have Kenyanthropus, which lived some 14 million years ago, and we are beginning to explore our gap."

He said presence of the canine fossa does not mean Kenyanthropus could speak, but it gave him that potential.

The National Geographic society, which supports the work of the husband-wife Leakey team, said their reports "suggest that Fort Ternan is yielding abundant fossils of odd creatures which the Leakeys will describe in detail when they visit Washington in March."

The society said the Leakey's "extraordinary finds include the first nearly complete skull of Proconsul africanus, a very ancient creature which many scientists believe represents the common stock leading both to man and apes."
