Pearsons, an American pilot, disclosing that a plan was proposed for a fake attack on the U.S. Naval base at Guantanamo to give U.S. forces an excuse to enter the Bay of Pigs invasion: "This was a very cynical approach to the problem, but as far as the rest of the world is concerned it would have been believable."

Washington - Dr. George M. Knauf, deputy director of aerospace medicine for the national aeronautics and space administration (NASA), commenting on future meals in space: "We expect to continue dining in space during the Gemini mission, but on dehydrated foods instead of the tubes of paste used in the Mercury program."
