Cabbage Source Of Vitamins; Low in Calories

Though cabbage contains only 130 calories to a pound, it is a good source of vitamins B and B2, contains some vitamin A as well as lime and iron and keeps most of its food value when cooked quickly.

Here is a recipe which is a quick and delicious way of preparing cabbage with an unusual flavor that comes from the addition of sauterne, a light, white dinner wine.

Creamy Cabbage is a recipe you will want to clip and use often.

CREAMY CABBAGE

Three tablespoons butter or margarine; two quarts thinly sliced cabbage; one-fourth cup sauterne or other white dinner wine; one teaspoon instant minced onion or one tablespoon finely chopped onion; one-half teaspoon caraway seeds; one teaspoon salt, and one-half pint commercial sour cream.

Melt butter in a large skillet. Add cabbage and cook over high heat, turning cabbage constantly with a spatula, for about two minutes or until cabbage is reduced to about one-half original bulk. Do not brown. Add all remaining ingredients except sour cream; cover, turn heat low and steam two minutes.

Remove from heat, add three-fourth cup sour cream and mix lightly. Turn into serving dish and top with remaining one-fourth cup sour cream.
