Olympic Committee Member Dr. Stiles To Support Portland

Portland -UPI—The Pacific Northwest's only member on the U.S. Olympic committee is to fly from Europe to New York Monday to give support to Portland's bid for the 1968 games.

Dr. Merritt A. Stiles, Spokane, told Portland's Olympic committee Monday he will make a special flight from Austria to appeal to the 44-man national group on Portland's behalf.

The national committee will hear appeals from Portland, Los Angeles, Detroit, and other cities in the United States before choosing an American city to compete internationally for the site of the Olympiad.

Portland's bid was heard last October by a seven-member site subcommittee. The group split between Los Angeles and Detroit and Detroit was later selected to represent the United States. Competition was reopened at the request of Los Angeles.

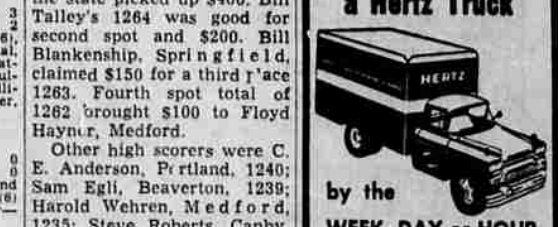
