This former Navy hospital ship travels around the world, stopping by request at various countries where the staff works to train medical technicians and helps

to set up medical clinics. Doctors serving on the ship volunteer their services on a two-month rotation basis. All funds for this project are from voluntary contributions. The General Federation of Women's club slogan for this administration is "strengthening the arm of liberty," and this is being done most effectively by the volunteers on the Mercy Ship Hope.

Dr. Jonas Salk is establishing an international foundation at La Jolla, Calif. The purpose of this foundation is to enable scientists from all nations to combine their efforts in a common goal.
