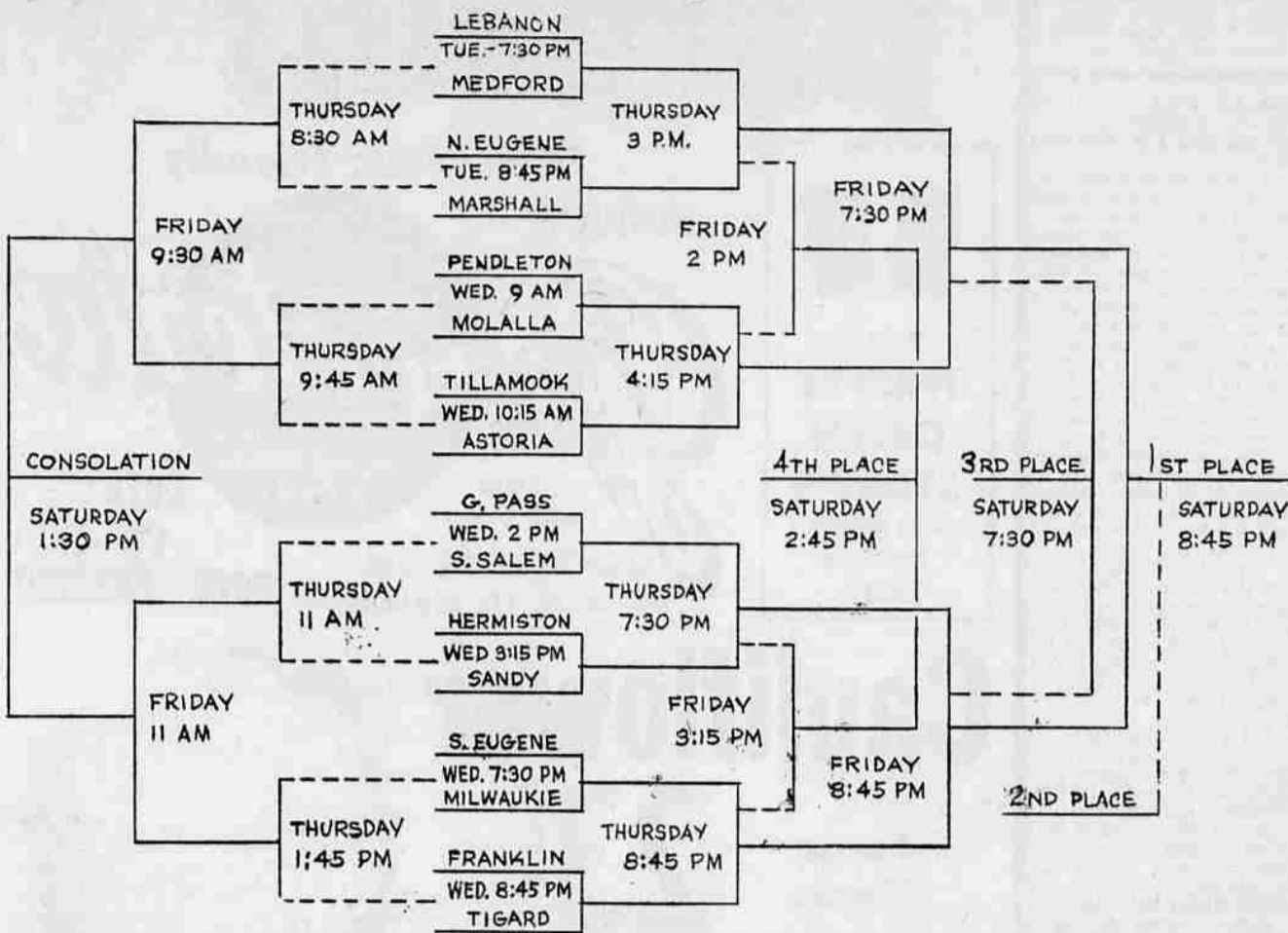


# A-1 Prep Basketball Tournament Bracket

### UO Duck Trackmen Defeat Cal

Eugene - (UP) - Oregon's defending NCAA track champions are off and running.

The Ducks, with Canadian weightman Dave Steen smashing two meet and school records, opened its season with a 79-66 dual meet victory over California last 2,200 Saturday.

It was Oregon's 37th straight two-way meet win at home.

Steen, a burly senior, won the shot put with 60 feet, 2 1/2 inches and captured the discus with 174 feet, 7 inches.

Mel Renfro and Keith Forman also picked up double wins for Oregon. Renfro won the broad jump in 23 feet, 1/4 inch and the 120-yard high hurdles in 15 seconds flat. Forman won the mile in 9:14.8 and the two-mile in 9:19.2.

## Medford Opposes Lebanon In A-1 Tournament Opener Tuesday Evening at Eugene

Sharing ambition to uphold Southern Oregon conference prestige, the Medford High school Black Torrado basketball squad left for Eugene today for the Oregon "A-1" basketball tournament.

Medford, District 6 A-1 totitileists, will appear for the first time in a Tuesday night opening game of the Big school titular tournament. Foes of the Black Torrado will be the Warriors of Lebanon high. Game time is 7:30 p.m.

This clash will be one of two on Tuesday night in University of Oregon's McArthur court. Six other first round games are billed for Wednesday. The 8:45 p.m. Tuesday tangle will match North Eugene and Portland's Marshall high.

Winners of the opening night encounters will contend on Thursdays in a 3 .m. quarterfinal. Losers will be rivals in an 8:30 a.m. Thursday consolation game.

While Medford enters the tourney as a League co-champion, Lebanon goes as the No. 2 club from the Valley league (District 8). Each was a pre-tourney favorite to reach the tournament. However, the Tornados got there the hard way. With the league campaign half through, Medford was in fourth place three games back of the loop leader. The locals then took their next eight straight conflicts to tie with the Grants Pass Cavemen for the diadem. They thereby carry a winning streak into the A-1 extravaganza.

The big twister goes into the tourney after missing the Big Show last year. Medford last won the championship in 1960. In 1961 the Tornado was runner up to Klamath Falls in one of the all-time great tournament finales. Last year, a cinderella Grants Pass aggregation carried on Southern Oregon conference domination by winning the championship - third straight for this district.
