Grants Pass Thumps South Salem; Medford Takes On North Eugene

Eugene — UPB — Defending champion Grants Pass rolled over South Salem 76-47 and ambitious Milwaukie upset South Eugene 47-41 to highlight first round games in the Oregon high school basketball tournament Wednesday.

A record Wednesday attendance of 22,018 turned out. Broken down, the crowds were 9,618 for the night session, 6,492 for the afternoon games and 5,458 for the morning session. The attendance raised the number of persons who watched the tournament in two days to 32,160.
