Suspect Held in Check Theft Case

Honolulu - (AP) - Donald K. Laird, 32, arrested by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents Friday for allegedly stealing a \$50,000 check from the U.S. government, remained in city jail today unable to post \$20,000 bond.

Laird was apprehended at his plush Waikiki apartment after the local office of the FBI received a complaint filed by the FBI in San Francisco.

The complaint charged the Kansas-born man with the theft of the check on or about March 11 at the Army-Air Force exchange in San Francisco.

According to the FBI, Laird, while at work as a processing clerk at the exchange, removed a check from a stack of checks being prepared for disbursement.

Subcommittees Consider Major Areas of Constitutional Plan

(This is the third in a series of articles about the revised Constitution proposed by the Oregon Constitutional Revision Commission.)

The Constitutional Revision Commission divided into subcommittees to consider the major areas of the constitutional system: Legislative, Executive, Judicial, Human Rights, Finance and Local Government, and Suffrage and Amendments.

The subcommittees, appointed by chairman George Layman, conducted hearings and reported their conclusions to the full Commission in the form of policy recommendations. Drafting the actual text of the new proposals was left to a special drafting committee, so that the revised Constitution has a uniform style and uses words consistently to have the same meaning throughout the document.

Each policy decision, and later each section of the revised Constitution, had to obtain a majority of nine votes in the full Commission before it could be adopted.

The Oregon Legislature, as in all states except Nebraska, has two houses—a Senate and a House of Representatives. The Commission considered the arguments made by some experts for a one-house legislature: It is less subject to obstruction or to deadlock, it can act faster, it could cost less to operate.

Moreover, Oregon is the only state that guarantees the right to refer tax measures to popular vote by petition. The Commission voted to retain this power of the people in the revised Constitution as a long-established Oregon tradition.

The Commission considered the arguments made by some experts for a one-house legislature: It is less subject to obstruction or to deadlock, it can act faster, it could cost less to operate.
