

The Family Council Advantages Seen In Kindergarten For Some Children

Mr. B. J. - She wants me to give up my pet.

Mrs. N. F. - I don't want to have to drown baby kittens.

Mr. B. J. - I'm a man of 73, living on welfare funds and boarding with Mrs. F. She's been very kind about my pets, a parakeet and a kitten. But now the kitten is a full-grown female cat and Mrs. F. wants me to let her go or have her destroyed. I know the reason of course. The tom-cats gather around our porch and send up a terrible howl. Mrs. F. just doesn't want the problem of kittens from Brindle.

All I can promise is to try and watch her. I can't afford to have her spayed by a veterinarian. And I do so want to keep her.

Mrs. N. F. - I have nothing against Mr. J. as a boarder. He's quiet, clean, and pleasant. But I haven't even let my own children keep a female pet, ever since I had to go through the horrible experience of drowning four baby kittens born to a stray cat who bedded down in our basement.

We keep two male dogs and even they come home at certain times all scared from the fights they get into with other dogs. I don't want any heartbreak that can be avoided. But Brindle is only a year-and-a-half old. He should part with her now, before he gets more attached, and get a male kitten.

benefit, if acceptance is based on a thorough evaluation of the child in relation to the particular school. A child's academic ability is the first area of growth which should be considered. If your child does not have a relatively high intellectual ability, you should drop the whole idea of early admission. This can be measured by a qualified psychologist using an individual I.Q. (intelligence quotient) test. Probably a minimum score of 125 should be required. Superior performance on a reading readiness test is an additional indication. The child's activities at home should be observed. Does he show an interest in learning to read? Maybe he already is reading simple stories. Has he developed any of the simple arithmetic skills? Physical growth and coordination are factors. If a child is small, this will be emphasized by moving him ahead. His motor skills should be carefully checked. Does he know left from right? Can he tie his shoelaces or button his shirt? A good indication is his ability to hold and manipulate a spoon or fork while eating. The child's social and emotional level are important. He should be ready for separation from his mother. This may be judged by his reaction to baby sitters. Is your child ready to become a member of a group? His ability to work with other children is a major part of kindergarten. You may be familiar with the term "attention span." In a school situation, students are often required to spend a reasonable length of time at one activity. Look at Effects

The entire question of under age admission to school may be clearer if you look at some of the long range effects. When going on dates becomes important, a teenager who is younger than his classmates

may be beneficial in certain cases. Professional assistance should be sought in considering all aspects of the child's growth before making the decision.

The individual whose muscles and coordination are underdeveloped will naturally be at a disadvantage in the area of athletics.

A student's academic placement in his class is a major concern. Will the child who is moved ahead still be an outstanding student? The importance of this is emphasized by the competitive nature of our society. The top students tend to get into the best colleges and are chosen for the best jobs.
