John W. T. Faulkner Dies in Tennessee - Oxford, Miss.-(UPI)-Author John W. T. Faulkner III, 61, whose literary fame was eclipsed by his famous brother William Faulkner, died in Memphis, Tenn., hospital Thursday. Faulkner died from what his physician said probably was a stroke following an operation for an inflamed pancreas. Services were planned today in the century and a half old Faulkner Mansion located just off the University of Mississippi campus, where both Faulkners once attended classes. Friends said Faulkner, who began his writing career more than 20 years after his brother, had given 3-2 odds he would return from the hospital. Both brothers used this small college town and its people for many of their stories and novels.
