

Medford, Bend, St. Mary's, Canyonville Win Class A-D Titles In Ore-Cal Relays

Ashland - Medford high school Class A, Bend romped in Class B, St. Mary's of Medford won in Class C and Canyonville nipped Bonanza in Class D yesterday in the afternoon-long Ore-Cal relay track and field meet at Southern Oregon college.

The Medford Black Tornado tallied 50 markers in its division to 45 1/2 by Grants Pass and 35 1/2 by Klamath Falls. Bend's Lava Bears rolled up 60 1/2 in Class B. Crater had 39 1/2 and Ashland 17.

St. Mary's scored 52 1/2 in C to edge Phoenix's 46 1/2. Weed 21, Canyonville beat out Bonanza in Class D by a half - point 46 to 45 1/2. Medford's Jim Hill, along with anchoring a couple of winning relay teams, successfully defended his invitational 100 - yard dash title with a 10 seconds flat performance.

Roy Shaw, Medford, won the invitational high hurdles in 15.3 and Dennis Brumback made it a clean Tornado sweep in the invite runs with 4:39.5 in the mile.

In the 100 Irish Ireland, Grants Pass, was second; Mike Diebele, Medford, third; Rice, Bonanza, fourth, and Jim Webb, St. Mary's, a n

Burnett, Bonanza, tied for fifth. Don Graham, Klamath Falls, was second in the high hurdles; Sam Charters, Eagle Point, third; Randy Clark, Grants Pass, fourth, and Jim Byrd, Myrtle Creek, fifth.

Last year's mile winner, Ed Cadman, Myrtle Creek was second to Brumback. Kerry Williams, Grants Pass, third; Bayer, Grants Pass, fourth and Mike McGuire, Ashland, fifth.

Medford was victor in six of the scored events in Class A. Grants Pass won four and Klamath Falls two. Bend dominated Class B with firsts in 10 events plus a tie for another. Crater took one first and tied for another and Ashland won one event.

In Class C St. Mary's of Medford claimed five victories. Phoenix took three events. Myrtle Creek won three including a snare of one event. Eagle Point and Weed, Calif., each had firsts.

Bonanza captured four events, and Glendale, Canyonville and Elkton each three. Days Creek took one.

Medford triumphed in the sprint relay, the two - mile, the mile, and the broad jump, the sprint medley and the half-mile relay. Grants Pass was winner of the shuttle hurdles and distance medley.

Gary Van Koten took the pole vault and Bob Shepard the high jump for the Cavernem. Mills won the shot and discus and Smith the javelin for Klamath Falls.

Rogue River Wins Dual, Three-Way Meets With Powers, Camas Valley

Grants Pass - Rogue River High school defeated Powers and Camas Valley in a three-way track meet here Saturday, and also won dual meets with both schools.

Results of the three-way scoring were Rogue River 78 1/2, Powers 44 and Camas Valley 29 1/2.

In dual scoring, it was Rogue River 76 Powers 46; Rogue River 87 Camas Valley 35; and Powers 64 Camas Valley 51.

Don Salyor of Rogue River won three events, the high jump, pole vault and 70-yard high hurdles. He set a new school record in the pole vault at 12 feet, breaking the 11 foot 8 inch mark set in 1960 by Art Johanson.

Ortiz-Vaillant Bout Postponed

San Juan, P. R. - UPP - Last night's scheduled World Lightweight Championship bout between champion Carlos Ortiz of New York and Doug Vaillant of Cuba was postponed when Ortiz was taken sick.

The champion, scheduled to make the second defense of the crown he won from Joe Brown last year, failed to show up for the weigh-in. It was announced that he was ill with stomach pains and vomiting and the fight was postponed. A new date was not immediately announced.

The fight, the first world title bout since the feather-weight contest in which Davey Moore was fatally injured on March 21, had been expected to draw a crowd of about 20,000 to Hiram Bithorn stadium.

Unusual safety precautions had been taken, including an announcement that four doctors would watch the bout from ringside, one from each corner of the ring.

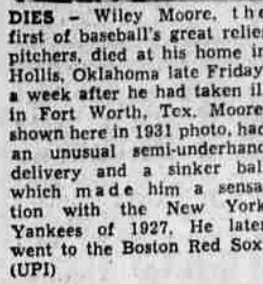

Yank Relief Hurler Dies

Hollis, Okla. - UPP - Wilcox Moore, whose 19 victories with the famed 1927 New York Yankees made him the first of baseball's great relief pitchers as well as one of its best "bargains," died Friday night at the age of 65.

The slim right-hander, whose unusual semi-underhand delivery and sinker ball made him a sensation as a 30-year-old rookie in 1927, had been taken critically ill in Fort Worth, Tex., a week ago, died at his home where he had returned to convalesce.

Services will be held in the Hollis First Methodist church at 3 p.m., today.

Moore's career was meteoric and relatively brief. He pitched in the majors from 1927 through 1933, five years with the Yankees and two with the Boston Red Sox, and had a 51-44 lifetime won-and-loss record.

In 1927, however, he was such a sensation that he is identified with the '27 Yankee team - often referred to as the greatest in baseball history - almost as readily as Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig, Herb Pennock and Walter Hoyt.

Ayala Wins Grand National Steeplechase

Aintree, England - UPP - Ayala, a 66-1 longshot which cost only \$560, responded gallantly to the whip in the stretch Saturday and spurred to the front in the last 100 yards to win the grand national steeplechase.

With more than four miles and 30 of the toughest fences in the world behind him, Ayala scored by three-quarters of a length. He earned a record purse of \$59,682 and determined the major winners in the Irish hospital sweepstakes.

A field of 47 started in the grueling race but only 22 of them finished. Four jockeys were injured but only Tony Biddlecombe, rider of Wingless, was seriously hurt. He suffered a fractured collarbone.
