SOVIET POLICEMEN SENTENCED TO DEATH
Moscow—Two Soviet policemen have been sentenced to death and two others to long prison terms for beating a young Communist leader to death, according to the newspaper Komsomolskaya Pravda.

RUSSIA, INDONESIA TO EXCHANGE INSTRUCTORS
Jakarta, Indonesia—Soviet Defense Minister Marshal Rodion Malinovsky has promised Indonesia an exchange of military instructors, Antara News Agency reported Sunday.

BELGIAN VETERANS CALL FOR NATIONAL UNITY
Brussels, Belgium—Thousands of flag-waving war veterans marched through downtown Brussels Sunday in a peaceful demonstration calling for national unity. The parade was directed against Flemish and Walloon groups who want Belgium reorganized along federal lines which would give them more self-rule.

Laborer Quizzed In Slaying of Portland Child

Portland—(UPI)—A 44-year-old laborer was being questioned about the kidnap-slaying of 6-year-old Mona Rae Minyard following his arrest Saturday on charges of molesting two girls who were playmates of the dead child.

Joseph Walton Holmes was arraigned Sunday on two charges of contributing to the delinquency of minors. The case was continued until Tuesday to give him a chance to consult an attorney. He was being held under \$10,000 bail.

"The fact that he lived practically next door to the Minyard girl and that these are the same types of cases makes us want to investigate further," Multnomah County Dist. Atty. George Van Housen said today. Otherwise, he would offer no comments on the case.

The Minyard girl's body was found Dec. 31, two days after she disappeared while on an errand for her mother.

Legislators Deny 'Do-Nothing' Charge

Senate To Debate Commuter Measure

Washington—(UPI)—The Senate today is scheduled to begin debate on a \$500 million proposal to aid the city bus rider and suburban railroad commuter.

Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield (Mont.) said there was no consensus among the Democrats on the bill "except for general agreement that there was need for a bill of some form."

The three-year program would give grants and other assistance to urban areas for the development of mass transportation systems by providing up to two-thirds of the deficit funds which could not otherwise be met through fares, borrowing and other local sources.

The AFL-CIO said it would oppose the bill unless an amendment was included to cover bargaining rights of

Salem—(UPI)—Legislative leaders today stoutly denied this was a "do nothing" legislature and charged Gov. Mark Hatfield was creating a "straw man issue" on higher education.

The comments were in answer to charges by Hatfield Saturday before the State Building Trades Council at Klamath Falls.

Hatfield warned of a possible \$5 million cut in higher education's budget, and said "there is still time to snatch higher education from the jaws of devastation."

House Speaker Clarence Barton and Senate President Ben Musa refuted the governor's charges.

Barton said: "Nothing has taken place in Ways and Means to indicate such a cut. No suggestions have been made to cut back on 4H, agricultural research, or the quality of education. Nor is this the desire of ways and means."

Musa commented: "Ways Means is simply asking 'do we need this? Is it necessary? When we pass the budget we'll know what the money is going for. That is our job.'"

Barton said the governor thought it "good finance" when the Department of Finance trimmed millions from agency requests. "But when the legislature trims, it is called budget assassination."

Both Barton and Musa said this was the "hardest working" legislature they have seen.

Barton said he applauded recent action by the Board of Higher Education to increase academic standards for out of state students.

"We don't want our colleges to become a dumping ground for the dregs that cannot enroll in schools in their home states. We don't want a bunch of simple simons cluttering up our classrooms," he said.

But Barton said "outstanding" out of state students should be encouraged to at-

tend Oregon institutions. He said he favored providing scholarship assistance for such "outstanding" students.

Musa charged Hatfield "twists the truth," and claims credit for gains made by the legislature. The Senate president said the Tax Court was

a result of a 14-year drive in the legislature, but that when it became a reality that Hatfield attempted to take all the credit.

Musa said the legislature was making a serious review of all requests. "We're not here to rubber

stamp anything, not for anybody," he snapped.
