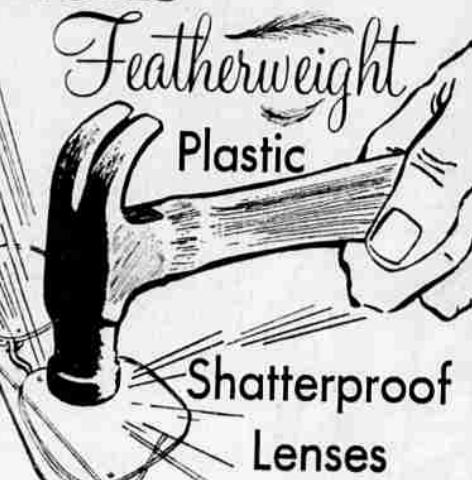
Pre-Easter Events Noted
