

Congregational In Ashland Holds 75th Anniversary

Ashland - Celebration of the 75th anniversary of the First Congregational church (United Church of Christ) was marked by day-long services March 24 when members and former members and pastors returned to Ashland for the event.

Dr. Adelbert J. Buttrey, Oregon Congregational conference minister from Portland, was the speaker at the morning worship hour. He reviewed the history of the Ashland church since its organization March 25, 1888. It is now the tenth oldest Congregational church in the state. Greetings were read from Dr. Ben M. Herbster, president of the United Church of Christ, New York; the Rev. Fred Plocher, former pastor who now is at Green River, Wyo., and from Mr. and Mrs. Fred Shephard, missionaries in Syria, who were commissioned in the Ashland church.

During the after-service fellowship hour Miss Margaret Ramsey was honored for having served as church organist for almost 30 years. On behalf of the congregation Miss Ramsey was presented with a gift of money.

Also given recognition was Henry C. Galey, whose affiliation with the Ashland Congregational church began in his boyhood. He now holds the record of being its oldest member.

A supper was served in the evening followed by a vesper hour at which the Rev. Armando Q. Zarza of the Philippines spoke on the needs of worldwide missions. An unscheduled feature of the evening was a surprise visit from the former minister, Army Chaplain Edward Wulfekuehler and his family.

Organized in 1888 The records show that 18 families met in 1888 to organize the Congregational church under the guidance of Dr. G. H. Atkinson, pastor of the Oregon City Congregational church, following a series of meetings the previous fall. Several months earlier four lots had been purchased on Main and Fourth sts.

Mrs. C. L. VanVleet was elected chairman of the first Congregational "society" and T. A. Eddings was named clerk at the March 25 meeting. The newly organized group called the Rev. G. J. Webster, Plymouth, Wis., to become its first pastor.

A New England type church was erected the following year and served the congregation until 1928 when the present building on Siskiyou Blvd. was constructed. Thirty-one ministers have served during the 75-year period. The Rev. Paul E. Otte came to Ashland last fall.

One of the features of the Congregational church building is a large carved bas relief on the boulevard outside wall in memory of Mrs. Joyce Beeson. It was created by Leroy Seiziol and dedicated in 1956.

Need Special Glass For Space Vehicle

Farmingdale, N. Y. - 476 - Scientists at Republic Aviation corporation are working on development of a special glass for a window no larger than a suit button. The window is for two re-entry vehicles which later this year will be launched and then rammed back through the atmosphere at speeds of about 25,000 miles per hour, with the purpose of studying the effects of re-entry temperatures.

Design of the vehicles calls for installation of a window no more than one-half inch in diameter, and some one-fifth of an inch thick. A special instrument, a radiometer, will be located behind this tiny porthole to record the intensity of the glowing atmospheric gas molecules. No glass existing today, RAC engineers say, has the necessary optical qualities and can withstand such white-hot heat without melting.
