Player First In Ryder Cup

Atlanta - (UP) - Most of the big name pros who came here Monday directly from the tough grind of the Masters tournament considered the Ryder Cup pro-am anti-climactic-but you couldn't prove it by Gary Player.

Player, the small pro from South Africa, finished fifth at the Masters and earned \$4,000 for four days work. He finished first here Monday and picked up a check for \$1,200 - a rate of \$200 per day better than his Masters pay.

Player turned in a brilliant four-under-par 66 on the beautiful dogwood-lined East Lake Country Club course to break the new course record and finish two strokes ahead of his closest rival. He picked up \$750 for being the pro with the lowest score and another \$450 for being in one of three teams that tied for second place in the four-ball pro-am event.
