Tennis Round Robin At Southern Oregon

Ashland-Tennis will be the only home athletic event featured at Southern Oregon college this week end. Raider courtmen host a round robin among Oregon State university, St. Mary's college and Willamette university.

Because of the unfavorable weather the Raiders have only played a few matches this season. During the week SOC had a dual meet scheduled with the University of Oregon at Eugene, but because of the weather were forced to cancel it after two postponements.

Coach Alex Petersen of SOC feels, "This will be one of the outstanding matches for SOC this season."

Coach Petersen announced that, if the weather didn't cooperate and all the schools concerned agreed, the matches would be held inside.

The schedule for the matches on Friday lists meets between SOC and OSU and between St. Mary's and Willamette.

Cassius Clay Will Take On Henry Cooper

Louisville, Ky. - (UP) - If Cassius Clay had his way, his next fight would be with former heavyweight champion Floyd Patterson.

But since Clay couldn't get together on terms with Patterson, he will meet British Empire champion Henry Cooper in a 10-rounder at London's Wembley Stadium, probably June 18.

Cocky Cassius is to receive \$50,000 or 27 1/2 per cent of the gate, whichever is greater, for the bout with the sturdy Englishman, who is ranked No. 8 among heavyweight contenders by the World Boxing association.

Clay, who is ranked second behind Patterson for a shot at Sonny Liston's crown, was willing to box Patterson for 30 per cent of the gate in New York's Madison Square Garden. The offer came from New York matchmaker Teddy Brenner.

Floyd rebelled at the idea of the 21-year-old Louisville Lip getting any more than 20 per cent. So that's where things stood - a complete standstill - when Clay's manager, Bill Favensham, agreed to the Cooper bout Wednesday.

Rogue Valley Schools Enter Hayward Relay Events Friday

Five high schools of the Rogue valley area will have participants in Eugene on Friday for the first day's activities of the University of Oregon's annual Hayward relays. Rogue River, St. Mary's and Illinois Valley will contend in Class C and Phoenix and Eagle Point in Class B.

St. Mary's will aim for its fifth straight mantle. But, a strong titular bid from Rogue River, third last year, is anticipated. The Chiefs signaled this by ending the reign of St. Mary's last Saturday in the Little Rogue relays at Phoenix.

Coach Frank Morris of the Chiefs said that he will take an 18-man squad to Eugene. The team will be almost the same as the one which took the Little Rogue toga. An exception will place Jim Fabrick in the 440-yard relay. He will fill the spot held down by Don Salyer. For, Salyer will move into the open high hurdle race.

Salyer will set his sights on the pole vault and high jump honors and run a leg of the shuttle hurdles in addition to vying in the high barriers.

Morris described the running of Fabrick, Ron Waite and Dave Lee as pleasant surprises last week. In the same category was the 133 discus throw of freshman Marl Carter, although he scratched.

Also, making Rogue River loom strong is the fact that its members have bettered Hayward records in the distance medley, the two-mile relay, the shuttles and pole vault.

Coach Bill McKibbin will take a defending crew of 17 St. Mary's athletes. Only five IV boys will make the trip, according to Coach Ron Brood. The Cougars have a triangular meet on the following day.

Phoenix will be represented by a crew of 23 boys, including alternates, Coach Hap Construk has reported.

Only three youths, Bob Bonner, Ed Hanscom and Sam Charters will make the Eugene trip for Eagle Point. Coach Vern Steward said that other Eagle Point trackmen will engage Crater junior varsity at 4 p.m. Friday at EP.

The Eagle freshman meet at Rogue River was moved to today. It was planned for tomorrow.

The five Southern Oregon conference schools will take teams to Eugene on Saturday for the Haywards. Medford, Grants Pass and Klamath Falls will be in the metropolitan division and Crater and Ashland in Class A.
