The Medford service will be held from noon to 3 p.m. at First Methodist church on "The Seven Attitudes of Holy Week." The committee in charge includes the Rev. Robert Tull, the Rev. Harvey Coovert, and Jack Willcuts.

Services at 2 p.m. at First Christian church will be for Medford High school students. Hedrick students may attend services at Eastwood Baptist and McLoughlin at First Church of the Nazarene at 1:30 p.m. Students wishing to attend the services must have written permission from their parents, otherwise they will not be excused from school.

The Ashland service will be at 7:30 p.m. at First Presbyterian church. The Rev. E. E. Crawford, pastor of the Church of the Nazarene, will speak.

## Dr. Sampson Article In Winter Issue

Ashland—Appearing in the winter issue of the Oregon Higher Education Association Quarterly is the second part of an article, "Charting a Professional Program," written by Dr. Bill A. Sampson, chairman of the Southern Oregon college education division, and president of the OHEA.

According to Dr. Sampson, there are a number of areas of development within the teaching profession which require immediate and unceasing attention. Among them, he listed:

"Revocation of Certificates," saying that some procedure for legally removing the right to teach from a person while in service should be a part of the profession's activities; "Professional Security and Tenure," in which he calls for those in the teaching profession to seek statewide tenure for all professional educators with built in protections for the public against poor performers; "In-service Professional Growth," considered imperative at professional association, country office, state department, and local levels; and "Professional Autonomy," involving the gaining of the public's complete confidence in the profession's ability to fully assume its responsibility for the quality of education in the U.S. through high professional and ethical standards.
