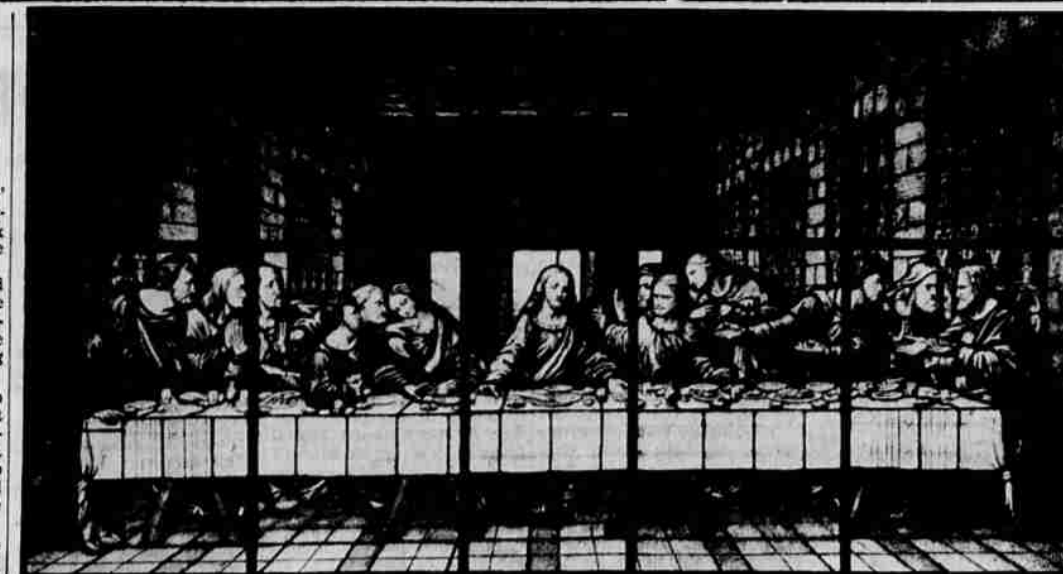
A tape recording will be played from the pastor, the Rev. Harold M. Sanner, who is currently holding meetings in Trinidad, West Indies.

Activities Planned At Sacred Heart Church Announced

The solemn observance of the Friday of the passion and death of the Lord will begin at 7:30 o'clock tonight in Sacred Heart church with the reading of several lessons from the Old Testament and St. John's account of the passion of Christ.

The remainder of the official Roman Catholic services for today will consist of three parts: the recitation of the solemn prayers for the needs of the church and all mankind; the unvailing and adoration of the cross which has been covered since Passion Sunday; and the distribution of holy communion which was consecrated on Holy Thursday and reserved in the tabernacle of the altar of repose until this time.

Good Friday is the only day of the year that the true mass cannot be offered in Catholic church and following the solemn commemoration of the day, the altars are stripped of all ornament and the church is left bare and desolate until the Easter Vigil services begin with its liturgy intended to return joy and hope to the sanctuary.

The Easter Vigil in Sacred Heart church will start at 11 p.m. Saturday with the light service, symbolic of Christ's resurrection and its effect upon man and man's gratitude in return.

During the second part of the Vigil, the baptismal service, the solemn blessing of the water for baptism will take place and the congregation will renew its baptismal promises.

Beginning at approximately midnight the Eucharistic service, or the first and most significant mass of Easter, will climax the Easter Vigil observance. The mass will end with the recitation of a shortened version of the Hour of Lauds, the official morning prayer of the church which recalls the resurrection each day of the year.

Other masses on Easter day will be at the usual Sunday hours of 6, 7, 8:30, 10 and 11:30 a.m. and at 7 p.m. in Sacred Heart church, at 9 a.m. in St. Joseph church in Jacksonville and at 10 a.m. in Our Lady of Fatima church in Shady Cove.

Assisting the parish priest in all of the Holy Week and Easter services will be altar boys from the parochial schools, the parish adult choir, St. Mary's Grade school choirs and the Marian choir and Boys' Glee club of St. Mary's High school.

Before and after tonight's services confessions will be heard in Sacred Heart church and again on Saturday between the hours of 1 to 5:30 and 7 to 10 p.m.

The Nocturnal hours which are normally kept the second Saturday of each month were observed at the altar of repose last night. The program of exposition and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be resumed on Saturday, May 11.

Apostolic Faith Plans Cantata

John W. Peterson's cantata, "No Greater Love," will be presented again this year by popular request as the highlight of Easter services at the Apostolic Faith church, according to the Rev. Loyce C. Carver, pastor.
