Rural Areas in State Show Enrollment Decline

The large metropolitan districts and their suburbs have experienced increases in public school enrollment in Oregon.

But, the small cities and rural areas show a declining trend in school population, according to the study made by Robert Skippen, a fellow at the University of Oregon.

Seven of eight districts in Jackson county reported increases in both elementary and secondary schools with the largest exception, the report states.

In Josephine county, Grants Pass lost enrollment, but the county unified district offset the loss.

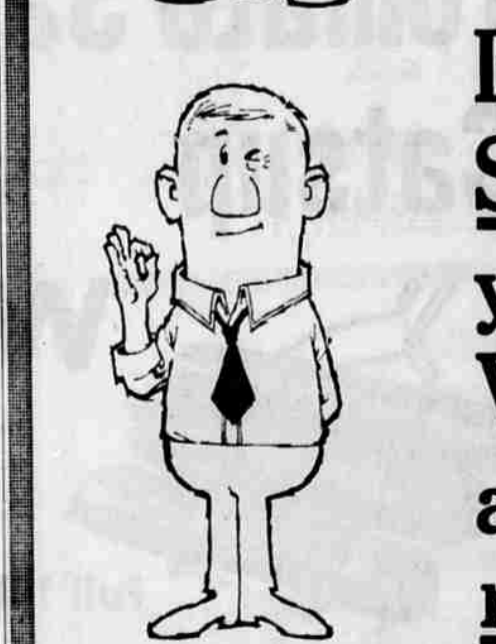
