Cooler Readings Predicted in West

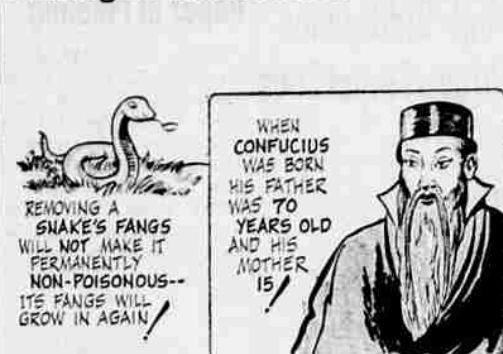
Washington — UPI — The Weather Bureau predicts above-average temperatures for most of the country during the next 30 days.

Boeing, Machinists Reach Agreement

Washington — UPI — The Boeing Co. and the international Association of Machinists reached tentative agreement on a new contract Monday, averting a strike by only a few hours.

William E. Simkin, director of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, said the terms of the new contract would not be announced until the union membership meets Wednesday to vote on it.

The chief stumbling block in the protracted negotiations was the union demand for a union shop.

If ratified, the agreement would afford more than 40,000 Boeing employees represented by the machinists. They had scheduled a strike for midnight, less than eight hours after the agreement was announced.

Burning Permits Needed in California

Yreka — Forest Supervisor Thornton of the Klamath National forest and Ranger Roy Bengard of the California Division of Forestry remind residents that the state burning law is in effect, and has been since April 15.

This law requires that anyone doing any burning of blasting on or near grass, brush or timber covered land in California must first acquire a written permit.

These permits are available at the Division of Forestry stations in Yreka, Hornbrook, Fort Jones and Mt. Hebron, and at the Forest service stations in Klamath River, Happy Camp, Seiad, Sawyers Bar, Fort Jones, Calahan, Mt. Hebron, and T3 Bar.

Youngster Survives Tumble From Auto

Pittsburgh — UPI — Pamela Reid, 3, Chicago, was in satisfactory condition today in Children's Hospital despite numerous fractures suffered when she fell from an automobile traveling 65 miles an hour on the Ohio Turnpike.

The accident occurred Sunday near Berea, Ohio, when the child fell out of the right rear door of an automobile driven by her stepfather, Thomas Stewart.

Police estimated the vehicle's speed at 63 miles per hour, the Ohio Turnpike speed limit.

The child was taken to a hospital in Berea with numerous cuts and bruises but was treated and released.
