

### Group To Attend Recreation Event

Charles Collins, executive secretary of the California Oregon Recreation Development association, will report on the activities of the Oregon Outdoor Recreation Council when the Oregon Parks association meets in Eugene Sunday through Wednesday.

Collins, as chairman of the council, will give his five minute report during the Wednesday luncheon and show the need for developing an overall state policy for parks and recreation areas in Oregon. He also will speak on a uniform policy for county park boards during the Monday session.

Jackson county parks and recreation commission members planning to attend are Laurence V. Espey, chairman, Medford; Mrs. Marcel LePinnic, Applegate; Mrs. Hanley Hefner, Medford; and Director Neil Ledward, Medford.

Topics will include leasing land, cooperative relations, recruitment and orientation of personnel, planning and developing camp facilities, group picnic facilities, development of a summer program, arts and crafts workshop and the philosophy of fees and charges.
