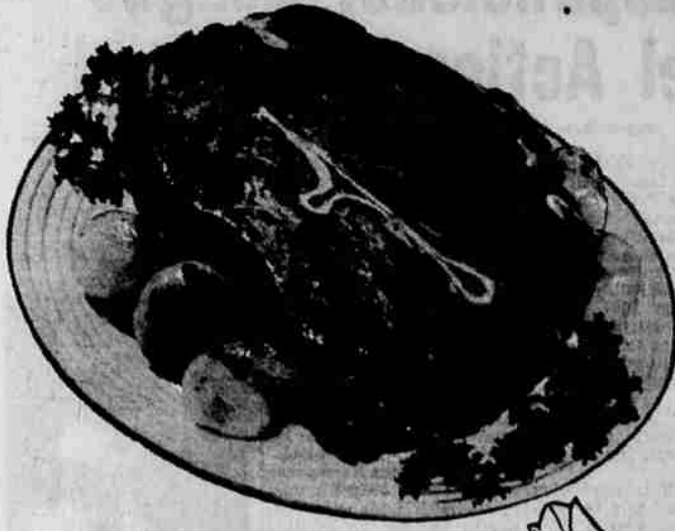

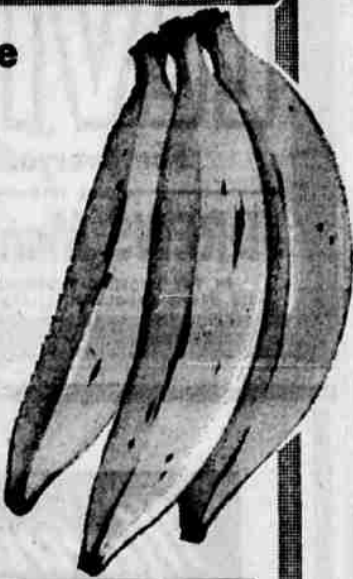

Stickers Promote Barry Goldwater For 1964 Election

Phoenix, Ariz.—(UPI)—The bright red-and-black bumper sticker reads "Goldwater for '64." It doesn't say for what office.

But, if a group of Arizonans have their way it will be "Goldwater for President." They have formed an organization to win support for Barry Goldwater and to show Arizona supports the Republican Senator.

And, in a way, that bumper sticker might have been the beginning of it all. For the last couple of years, Goldwater supporters have offered stickers and kept a list of those who asked for them. List of 144,000.

The fact that they now have a list of 144,000 names encourages the Arizona "Goldwater for President" group, headed by W. D. (Don) Palmer, advertising director of the Arizona Bank and chairman of the organization.

Reaching into a cardboard box file, Palmer withdrew a handful of letters, leafed through them and read the cities and towns of those who had written for stickers: "Report With People"

"Hobbs, N.M., Winchester, Mass., Schenectady, N.Y., Midland, Tex., Annandale, Va., York, Pa., Stillwater, Minn., Riverton, Wyo., Islip, N.Y., Gallatin, Tenn., and Seattle, Wash."

"Need I go on?" Palmer asked.

"I think the people of this country have indicated support for Senator Goldwater. He has a tremendous rapport with the American people."

Headquarters for the organization is at 4025 North 8th st. in Phoenix. It's behind a generator shop and across a busy road from the Veteran's hospital.

The organization now has desk space in a one-room building. A large picture of Goldwater sits on the back of a couch and a small table holds the bumper stickers and file of names.

So far, the group has one paid employee—Mrs. Bernice Batterton, the secretary who answers the telephone. No Assurance

Mrs. Batterton estimated the organization has signed more than 350 members since early April, accepting donations of \$2 to \$250.

Palmer said the modest quarters are temporary.

The organization expects to move soon, but the chairman said that expenses would be kept at a minimum with excess money going into an escrow account for Goldwater's campaign—if he decides to campaign.

And, on that subject, Palmer said it was strictly the senator's decision because the present group has had no assurance Goldwater will run for president.

Palmer said there were similar organizations in 43 states. He listed those that didn't have groups as Idaho, Montana, North Dakota, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Maine, Alaska and Hawaii.

16,000 Letters Sent to Hoover
C. C. Hoover, distinguished senior citizen for 1963, better known as Jackson county's "tree man," has received many letters 16,000 in fact, from school children to whom he has given trees. But one written March 28 he thinks warrants publication.

It reads: "The trees are growing now. My trees that you gave me last year are about two feet long. The Russian olive tree, I did not want to take. I thought Russians made them, but God made the Russian olives so I took one."

The letter was written by Scott Henselman, Hoover school.

Hoover has now distributed 300,000 trees, 10,000 since Sept. 1, 1962. Of this number, 10,000 were Russian olives. He has visited most of the schools in Jackson county twice with his tree gift program and is going into northern California as soon as he completes the distribution of trees in Douglas county.
