

Renfro, Blunt Lead Webfeet To Track Victory Over BYU

Eugene, Ore. — (UPI) — Mel Renfro and Dave Blunt each scored double wins to pace defending NCAA champion Oregon to a 96-49 dual track meet over Brigham Young Saturday.

Renfro won the 120-high hurdles in 14.3 and the broad jump in 23-3 1/2 and Blunt captured the 100-yard dash in 9.9 and the 220 in 22.3.

The Ducks, winning their third two-way meet in four starts, took 13 first places in the 17 events.

Oregon's John Burns turned in one of the nation's top college efforts in the javelin event this year with a 250-1/2 throw. It broke the Hayward field record of 249-6 1/2 set by Al Cantello of the U.S. Marines in an Olympic training meet in 1960.

It was one of the four meet records broken. Three were tied.

Another top Oregon effort was by Keith Forman in a two-mile event.

Brigham Young's wins came by Bob Cowart in the high jump, Bob Towler in the 440-yard dash, Howard Parker in the 330-yard intermediate hurdles and Ron Miele in the discus.

Cowart went 6-8 to win over the Duck's Paul Stuber and Terry Lively.

Rain fell during the meet, which was watched by 3,500 persons.

VA Bowling Tabulations Being Sent

White City — Bowling members at the Veterans Administration domiciliary here have completed final matches with Medford teams, and tabulations will be forwarded to the National Mail-O-Matic Bowling tournament, according to Al Birman, head of sports.

Entered in the national competition of all VA hospitals and domiciliaries in the 1,000 men division, the local bowlers placed 12th in the nation last year. Total scores this year for the members bowling 60 lines were 9,354 pins against 9,321 pins scored last season. This gave the veteran keepers an average of 155.9 pins per game.

The tournament is sponsored by the Bowlers Victory legion, the armed services wing of the American Bowling congress. The Medford Bowling association, through Riley Applegate, president, and Pink O'Connor, secretary, arranged for the opposition and provided official representatives to certify all games rolled.

Graham Electric lost two to one, while the vets rolled 2,385 to 2,313 pins. Irving (Chief) Gray, a former Army singles champion, took high total with 525.

Ren Taylor Insurance had a disappointing night on strange alleys while losing to the Vets 2,453 to 2,094. Gray again was high man, with 565.

The fourth and last match, April 16, pitted Overhead Door Co. against the veterans, who won 2,236 to 2,131.
