Rescue Operation Saves Three in Northern Oregon

Portland—(UP)—Two rescues occurred east of here during the week end—one after a dog accidentally knocked a youth into a 150-foot ravine and the other when two teenagers got stranded on a cliff near Multnomah Falls.

Edwin Miller, 20, Gresham, was knocked off his feet by his full grown collie dog into the ravine along the Sandy river late Saturday. A doctor and sheriff's deputies were lowered by ropes and spent the night with him.

He was reported in "fair" condition in a hospital with multiple fractures and other injuries. He was brought out of the ravine early Sunday.

His brother, Kenneth, 23, said the two were planning to get down to the river and camp until dawn, then go fishing.

Dog Lost Footing

Kenneth said the dog apparently lost its footing and slid, knocking Edwin's feet from under him. He said the dog jumped after its master and was killed.

James Stewart, 14, and Delores Pugh, 13, both of Portland, were stranded for about two hours Sunday evening some 600 feet up a bluff a mile east of Multnomah Falls. Deputies said the boy had dropped a .22 rifle and got stuck when he went to get it. The girl tried to reach him and got within 200 feet when it got dark.

Both held onto roots and branches until rescuers secured a rope to the top of the cliff and pulled them up.

Deputy Sheriff Jack Kraushaar said young Stewart could not have held on much longer.

Cherries Lacking In Cherry Pies

Washington—(UP)—The picture on the frozen cherry pie package showed a luscious pie wedge with 34 mouth-watering cherries visible.

But Sen. Philip A. Hart (D-Mich.) said today that when he investigated he found the whole eight-inch pie contained only 40 cherries.

"They were only one cherry deep and even then the cherries weren't packed tightly side-by-side but were swimming in a thin paste apparently composed of corn starch," he reported.

Hart, sponsor of the "truth in packaging" bill now before Congress and whose home state produces 80 per cent of the nation's cherry crop, was indignant.

"I am going to ask the Food and Drug Administration to set some standard on how many cherries a pie should contain," he said.

Hart said a 10-inch pie from the Senate cafeteria contained 163 cherries. He figured that on this basis, an eight-inch pie baked in the Senate kitchen "would contain about 108 cherries, compared to the 40 lonely cherries in the frozen model."

The FDA has the power to set standards of content, Hart said.

Hospital Psychiatrist Scheduled To Speak

Dr. John Rennebohm, Salem psychiatrist and director of Unit 6 at the Oregon State hospital, will be in Medford, Monday, May 6, to speak at the annual meeting of the Jackson County Mental Health association, according to Dewey Wilson, association president.

Other unit staff members who will address the meeting are Dr. George Sakurai, psychiatrist and Miss Nina Garton, social service worker.

Unit 6 consists of patients from counties of Jackson, Josephine, Douglas, Coos and Curry. This is the new decentralization plan for care of the mentally ill at the state hospital, Wilson explained.

The May meeting will be open to the public and will include discussion of the decentralization plan, new concepts in the care of the mentally ill, new discharge policies and a question period, Wilson said.

The meeting is scheduled for the Rogue Valley hospital at 8 p.m.

Army Program Is Noted for Seniors

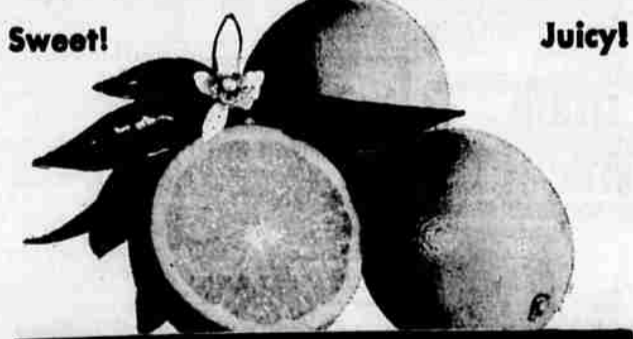
