Brown Raps Nixon For Speech Urging Exiles Be Unleashed

Phoenix - (UP) - Gov. Edmund G. Brown of California has attacked Richard M. Nixon for a speech in which the former vice president suggested the United States unleash the Cuban exiles.

Brown, a Democrat who won his second four-year term by defeating Nixon last November, told newsmen at the Western Governors' Conference "I thought that speech was a disgrace. It was a masterpiece of double talk."

Nixon, speaking to the American Society of Newspaper Editors Saturday, charged President Kennedy "with pulling defeat out of victory" and called for backing the exiles.

Nixon said comment on the speech was overwhelmingly in his favor and blamed bad advice from the Defense Department for administration actions on the Cuban situation.

But Brown, who spoke to newsmen shortly after he arrived at the conference in nearby Scottsdale, charged angrily: "It's not worthy of a man of his stature."

Brown called Nixon's address "the kind of double talk that resulted in his defeat as governor" of California. Nixon lost to Brown by nearly 300,000 votes.

Despite his attack on Nixon, Brown said he still felt Nixon would play a great role in national Republican politics during the next year. But the governor said Nixon could not be called a king maker.

Asked by newsmen whether he felt New York Gov. Nelson Rockefeller or Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona was the best "pigeon" for Kennedy in next year's presidential election, Brown replied:

"Well, I wouldn't want to call Senator Goldwater a pigeon but I think he would be easiest to beat. He represents the extreme right and

Bullets Wound Vancouver Pair

Vancouver, Wash. - (UP) - A young school teacher and her college student husband were in serious condition today following a shooting at an elementary school.

Sheriff Clarence McKay said Frank N. Martin, 22, a student at Clark college here, apparently shot and wounded Mrs. Judith Martin, 23, and then wounded himself. The shooting occurred in Mrs. Martin's first grade classroom at Minnehaha Elementary school before students arrived.

Mrs. Martin suffered wounds in the hand and head and Martin a wound in the head.

McKay said Mrs. Martin had filed suit for divorce and had obtained a court order Tuesday directing Martin to stay away from her. Mrs. Martin's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edmond Michaels of Vancouver, accompanied her to school Wednesday morning because of concern for her safety, the sheriff said.

The parents said they were en route home when they saw Martin going to the school and returned just as the shooting occurred. The Martins were married in March of 1962. Both attended local high schools.

Target Date Set For Tax Program

Salem - (UP) - Probable features of a Senate tax program, and a 10-day target date for completion of committee work on it, were revealed Wednesday by Senate Tax Committee Chairman Boyd Overhulse (D-Madras). The committee is ready to start work on the tax program passed by the House: A \$35 million income tax bill, a \$15 million cigarette tax, and a \$12 million one-shot bill to speed turnover of withholding payments.
