

Grazing Lands Bill Rescued From House

Salem—A bill providing for management programs on state grazing lands has been rescued from the House floor and referred to committee after opponents assailed it as "unconstitutional" and a "raid on school lands."

The bill would authorize the State Land Board to issue management regulations. It provides for classification and blocking of state grazing lands, and for loans from the common school fund to lessees for land improvement.
