Corvallis (UPI)—Coach Sam Bell of the Oregon State track and field team said today the Beavers have a chance in every running event against Oregon in their dual meet here Saturday.

Oregon, which has won 16 straight meets over the Beavers since Bill Bowerman has been the Webfoots' head coach, will be favored. However, Bowerman has been quoted as saying that Oregon must capture either the 440 or the mile relay to win.

Bell was hopeful that OSU sophomore Morgan Groth might pull an upset in the mile against Oregon's Keith Forman and Archie San Romani. Norm Hoffman of OSU has the fastest college time in the country this spring in the half mile, 1:49.5, while Oregon's Ray Van Asten has done 1:49.9.
