At 12 noon, Thursday, a session will be devoted to cre-

ative writing in Britt 207. At 3 p.m., another film program may be viewed in Britt 118, followed by the French play, "Rosalie" at 4 p.m. in Britt ballroom. In the evening, at 8 o'clock, there will be another opera workshop conducted in Churchill auditorium.

University of Utah, will lecture on the topic, "Research on Creativity," at 2 p.m. in Britt 207, and present his main address at 8 p.m. in Churchill auditorium. Immediately afterwards there will be a reception for the speaker in the Britt lounge.

ber of students in a dance recital in Churchill auditorium at 8 p.m. On Sunday, May 12, the festival will conclude with a piano recital in Churchill auditorium at 3 p.m.

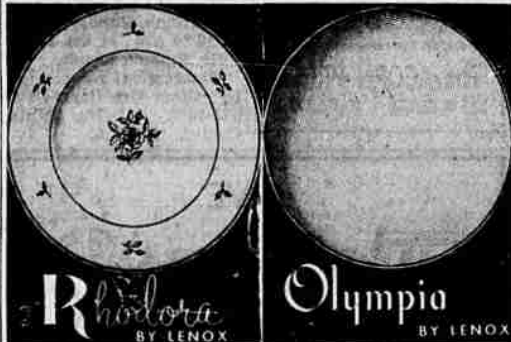
