Two Accidents Are Reported in City

Medford police investigated two non-injury vehicle accidents in the city Wednesday. No citations were issued, officers said.

Police were notified Wednesday of an accident which occurred about 11:55 a.m. Saturday, May 4, at South Oakdale ave. and West Main st. Drivers involved were Donald Clifford Williams, 29, of 717 Lawnsdale ave., and Felix Peter Francks, 68, of 920 West 11th st.

Police were told the accident was not reported earlier because the drivers did not realize their vehicles had sustained any damage in the mishap.

Good Sweet Treats With Coffee for Mother's Day

Ahead of Mother's Day last year we talked of pampering Mother with breakfast in bed, a fresh copy of the newspaper, maybe a stack of new and different magazines and other contributions to a lazy morning. We were roundly scolded by a thoughtful letter-writing reader who asked us if we didn't realize that a good mother gave her family a good breakfast and then went to church with them on "her" day just as she did every other Sunday morning.

So we're not taking any chances on that "breakfast-in-bed routine" this year. Instead, we suggest that Mother's Day be celebrated on Saturday, Sunday (before or after church), Monday or any other day when loving members of the family plan a "kaffee klatsch" because our experience indicates that Mother does like good conversation. And coffee with anything is the best known promoter of good conversation.

In German, "kaffee klatsch" means a gossip session over a cup of coffee. In America, it means a warm and friendly welcome to a neighbor or a friend who stops by for a chat. On our west coast, it often is the motif for an important party with many friends and neighbors coming and going - and lots of good conversation.

Whether a few friends or many, it is our neighborly custom to offer a sweet treat and that is our mission for today. Chocolate Coconut Triangles Pictured

Women who bake with yeast like the new and unusual in recipes for sweet

bread. In a recent poll of food editors, it was found that there is great interest in breads that are different and that show off the baker's culinary skill. Economy doesn't seem to be a factor. Home bakers want a product that is attractive and tasty. So we suggest that you plan this and perhaps other home-baked specialties for the important kaffee klatsch - or just for the ever-loving family.

Although chocolate and coconut are familiar flavors in cake baking, their appearance in a yeast-raised sweet dough is something out of the ordinary - is extraordinarily good.

- 1 cup milk
1/2 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup (1 stick) margarine
1/2 cup warm water
1 package or cake yeast, active dry or compressed
4 cups unsifted flour
1 egg
4 cups unsifted flour
Chocolate Coconut Filling*
1 egg yolk
1 tablespoon milk
1/2 cup chopped pecans
Scald milk; stir in sugar, salt and margarine; cool to lukewarm. Measure warm water into large warm bowl. Sprinkle or crumble in yeast; stir until dissolved. Stir in lukewarm milk mixture, egg and two cups flour; beat until smooth. Stir in remaining flour to make a stiff batter. Cover tightly with waxed paper or aluminum foil. Refrigerate dough at least two hours. Dough may be kept in refrigerator up to three days.

Divide dough in half. Roll each half into a 9 x 20 inch oblong. Spread Chocolate Coconut Filling* over bottom two-thirds of each oblong. Fold the top third down to cover the center third and fold again to cover the bottom third. Combine egg yolk and milk. Brush with egg yolk mixture and sprinkle with chopped pecans. Cut into two-inch triangles and place on greased baking sheet. Let rise in warm place, free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 45 minutes. Bake in hot oven, 425 degrees, about 15 minutes.

*Chocolate Coconut Filling. Combine one-third cup sugar, one tablespoon margarine, melted, one cup flaked coconut, one tablespoon flour, one tablespoon cornstarch, one-third cup vanilla wafer crumbs and one tablespoon cocoa. Mix well. Stir in one egg, 1 1/2 tablespoons water and a dash of salt. Mix until smooth. Proceed as suggested above.

Festive Coffee Cake Tart-Sweet Delight Tart cranberries from a can of whole cranberry sauce and sweet cheery raisins highlight this excellent coffee cake for many compliments from family and friends. Spread the spicy raisin dough in the bottom of a pan and cover with a layer of whole cranberries from a can of well-drained whole cranberry sauce; sprinkle with a spiced sugar topping. Serve this fresh from the oven with plenty of butter. Makes eight servings.

- 2 cups sifted flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup shortening
2/3 cup dark or golden raisins
1 egg, beaten
1/2 cup milk
